Medicare Part D At the time of Medicare's passage, more than 90% of drug spending Medicare Part D, also called the Medicare prescription drug benefit, is an optional United States federal-

government program to help Medicare beneficiaries pay for self-administered prescription drugs. However, plans are later reimbursed for much of this cost through rebates paid by manufacturers and pharmacies. by the launch of many billion dollar “blockbuster drugs” like Lipitor, Celebrex, and Zoloft. Part D plans typically pay most of the cost for prescriptions filled by their enrollees. Under the program, drug benefits are provided by private insurance plans that receive premiums from both enrollees and the government. Part D was enacted as part of the Medicare Modernization Act of 2003 and went into effect on January 1, 2006 84ebbc48e7
