However, the Filipinos have transposed the Spanish latter (maternal) name to the American English system of using the maternal surname as a "middle name", and adopting the American English system of using the paternal surname as the formal "last name". The particle y is used only for legal purposes and is otherwise dropped. The middle name in its natural sense would have been the second name if the person had one, but it is never counted as an individual's given name.
