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circulating blood against the walls of blood vessels. Blood pressure is usually expressed in terms of the systolic pressure (maximum pressure during one heartbeat) over diastolic pressure (minimum pressure between heartbeats) in the cardiac cycle. Most of this pressure results from the heart pumping blood through the circulatory system. It is measured in millimetres of mercury (mmHg) above the surrounding atmospheric pressure, or in kilopascals (kPa). The difference between the systolic and diastolic pressures is known as pulse pressure, while the average pressure during a cardiac cycle is known as mean arterial pressure

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NASA has reported that fifteen long-duration male astronauts (45–55 years of age) have experienced confirmed visual and anatomical changes during or after long-duration flights.

In the neck, the jugular veins parallel the upward course of the carotid Cerebral circulation is the movement of blood through a network of cerebral arteries and veins supplying the brain. Arteries deliver oxygenated blood, glucose and other nutrients to the brain. The neurovascular unit regulates cerebral blood flow so that activated neurons can be supplied with energy in the right amount and at the right time.

The rate of cerebral blood flow in an adult human is typically 750 milliliters per minute, or about 15% of cardiac output. Sudden intense accelerations change the gravitational forces perceived by bodies and can severely impair cerebral circulation and normal functions to the point of becoming serious life-threatening conditions. The volume of blood in circulation is called the cerebral blood flow. The failure of these safeguards may result in a stroke. Because the brain would quickly suffer damage from any stoppage in blood supply, the cerebral circulatory system has safeguards including autoregulation of the blood vessels 4d93527910

4d93527910 Central lines are used to administer medication or fluids that are unable to be taken by mouth or would harm a smaller peripheral vein, obtain blood tests (specifically the "central venous oxygen saturation"), administer fluid or blood products for large volume resuscitation, and measure central venous pressure. The catheters used are commonly 15-30 cm in length, made of silicone or polyurethane, and have single or multiple lumens for infusion. 4d93527910

Treatment is typically with anticoagulants (medications that suppress blood clotting) such as low molecular weight heparin. Rarely, thrombolysis (enzymatic destruction of the

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blood clot) or mechanical thrombectomy is used, although evidence for this therapy is limited. 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cerebrospinal venous insufficiency (CCSVI or CCVI) is a term invented by Italian researcher Paolo Zamboni in 2008 to describe compromised flow of blood in the veins draining the central nervous system. Zamboni hypothesized that it might play a role in the cause or development of multiple sclerosis (MS)
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Central venous catheter These catheters are commonly placed in veins in the neck (internal jugular vein), chest (subclavian vein or axillary vein), groin (femoral vein), or through veins in the arms (also known as a PICC line, or peripherally inserted central catheters). Venous thrombosis particular specific risk factors: Cerebral venous sinus thrombosis,

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cavernous sinus thrombosis and jugular vein thrombosis: thrombosis of the veins of Venous thrombosis is the blockage of a vein caused by a thrombus (blood clot). A common form of venous thrombosis is deep vein thrombosis (DVT), when a blood clot forms in the deep veins. If a thrombus breaks off (embolizes) and flows to the lungs to lodge there, it becomes a pulmonary embolism (PE), a blood clot in the lungs. The initial treatment for VTE is typically either low-molecular-weight

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heparin (LMWH) or unfractionated heparin, or increasingly with direct acting oral anticoagulants (DOAC). Those initially treated with heparins can be switched to other anticoagulants (warfarin, DOACs), although pregnant women and some people with cancer receive ongoing heparin treatment. Superficial venous thrombosis or phlebitis affects the superficial veins of the upper or lower extremity and only require anticoagulation in specific situations, and may be treated with anti-inflammatory pain relief only. 4d93527910 There is no scientific evidence that CCSVI is related to MS, and there is no good evidence that the surgery helps MS patients. Zamboni's first published research was neither blinded nor did it have a comparison group. Zamboni also did not disclose his financial ties to Esaote, the manufacturer of the ultrasound specifically used in CCSVI diagnosis. The "liberation

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catheterization or right heart catheterization. The procedure can also be used to measure pressures in the heart chambers. It is also a good measure for those needing intravenous fluid therapy, for instance post heart surgery, shock, and severe burns
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It begins in the posterior compartment of the jugular foramen, at the base of the skull.
