In small towns and rural areas the latter continued in use well into the 20th century, until such areas were finally electrified and light bulbs could be used. Coir Mature brown coir fibres contain more lignin and less cellulose than fibres such as flax and cotton, so are Coir (), also called coconut fibre, is a plant fibre extracted from the outer husk of coconut, used in products such as floor mats, doormats, brushes, and mattresses, as well as horticulturally in potting mixes and soil amendments. Coir is the fibrous material found between

the hard, internal shell and the outer coat of a coconut. Brown coir, made from ripe coconut, is further used in upholstery padding, sacking, and horticulture, and white coir, from unripe coconut, for making finer brushes, string, rope, and fishing nets. typically used in mats, brushes and sacking. Coir will float in water, so can be used in long lengths in deep water without adding weight that might drag down boats and buoys. In some countries it is locally called coprah (not to be confused with copra, a dry coconut meat) e9cf7aaac0

Maharashtrian cuisine includes mild and spicy dishes. Wheat, rice, jowar, bajri, vegetables, lentils and fruit are dietary staples. Peanuts and cashews are often served with vegetables. Different processes have been used to adopt these symbols - some are conferred by government bodies, whereas others are the result of informal public polls. William Stearn (1911–2001) was one of the pre-eminent British botanists of the 20th century: a Librarian of the Royal Horticultural Society, a president of the Linnean Society and the original drafter of the International Code of Nomenclature for Cultivated Plants.
