The appearance of transitional epithelium differs according to its cell layer. Cells of the basal layer are cuboidal (cube-shaped), or columnar (column-shaped), while the cells of the superficial layer vary in appearance depending on the degree of distension. These cells appear to be cuboidal with a domed apex when the organ or the tube in which they reside is not stretched. When the organ or tube is stretched (such as when the bladder is filled with urine), the tissue compresses and the cells become stretched. When this happens, the cells flatten, and they appear to be squamous and irregular... b861216e15 Initial treatment is most commonly either partial or complete removal of the affected kidney(s). Where the cancer has not metastasised (spread to other organs) or burrowed deeper into the tissues of the kidney, the five-year survival rate is 65–90%, but this is lowered considerably when the cancer has spread. b861216e15 Studies to date have suggested that PDPN acts to promote or inhibit a wide range of physiological and pathological reactions in rodents and, in a few studies, humans. They are potentiated by alkaline urine and high magnesium excretion (high magnesium/plant-based diets). They also are potentiated by a specific urinary protein in domestic cats. b861216e15 Although struvite was briefly mentioned in Hooke's Micrographia, it was first described in detail in 1845 by the German chemist Georg Ludwig Ulex (1811–1883), who found crystals of struvite in what he surmised had once been a medieval midden in Hamburg, Germany; he named the new mineral after the geographer and geologist Heinrich Christian Gottfried von Struve (1772–1851) of Hamburg. b861216e15 A Pap smear is performed by opening the vagina with a speculum and collecting cells at the outer opening of the cervix at the transformation zone (where the outer squamous cervical cells meet the inner glandular endocervical cells), using an Ayre spatula or a cytobrush. Simple squamous epithelium This epithelium facilitates passive diffusion and filtration due to its thinness. It is found in areas such as the alveoli of the lungs, the lining of blood vessels (endothelium), and the serous membranes of body cavities. Simple squamous epithelium consists of a single layer of flat, scale-like cells with centrally located,

When this happens, the cells flatten, and they appear to be squamous and irregular Transitional epithelium, also known as urothelium is a type of stratified epithelium that changes shape in response to stretching. This tissue consists of multiple layers of epithelial cells which can contract and expand in order to adapt to the degree of distension needed. Transitional epithelium usually appears cuboidal when relaxed and squamous when stretched. Transitional epithelium lines all of the organs of the urinary system – the kidneys, ureters, bladder, and the urethra, hence its alternative name of urothelium. Urinalysis Macroscopic examination targets parameters such as color, clarity, odor, and specific gravity; urine test strips measure chemical properties such as pH, glucose concentration, and protein levels; and microscopy is performed to identify elements such as cells, urinary casts, crystals, and organisms. Some laboratories do not Urinalysis, a portmanteau of the words urine and analysis, is a panel of medical tests that includes physical (macroscopic) examination of the urine, chemical evaluation using urine test strips, and microscopic examination. Leukoplakia The edges of the lesion are typically abrupt and the lesion changes with time. It usually occurs within the mouth, although sometimes mucosa in other parts of the gastrointestinal tract, urinary tract, or genitals may be affected. Leukoplakia is a firmly attached white patch on a mucous membrane which is associated with increased risk of cancer. " Oral leukoplakia is a gray patch or plaque that develops in the oral cavity and is strongly associated with smoking. The distinction between the epithelial layers may be lost. Advanced forms may develop red patches. the epithelial layers. It is defined as "essentially an oral mucosal white/gray lesion that cannot be considered as any other definable lesion. There are generally no other symptoms. Normally stratified squamous epithelium shows progressive changes in the Oral leukoplakia is a potentially malignant disorder affecting the oral mucosa b861216e15

Pap test The test was independently invented in the 1920s by the Greek physician Georgios Papanikolaou and named after him. The collected cells are examined The Papanicolaou test (abbreviated as Pap test, also known as Pap smear (AE), cervical smear (BE), or smear test (BE)) is a method of cervical screening used to detect potentially precancerous and cancerous processes in the cervix (opening of the uterus or womb) or, more rarely, anus (in both men and women) or the vaginal vault. In patients who have had a hysterectomy, the cervix is normally removed and Pap smears are not indicated (unless the uterus was removed on suspicion of neoplasia). Abnormal findings are often followed up by more sensitive diagnostic procedures and, if warranted, interventions that aim to prevent progression to cervical cancer b861216e15

== Name == b861216e15 The cause of leukoplakia is unknown. Risk factors for formation inside the mouth include smoking, chewing tobacco, excessive alcohol, and use of betel nuts. One specific type is common in HIV/AIDS. It is a precancerous lesion, a tissue alteration in which cancer is more likely to develop. The chance of cancer formation depends on the type, with between 3–15% of localized leukoplakia and 70–100% of proliferative leukoplakia developing into squamous cell... b861216e15 The urethra is a fibrous and muscular tube which connects the urinary bladder to the external urethral meatus. Its length differs between the sexes, because it passes through the penis in males. b861216e15 == Background == b861216e15 The main types of kidney cancer are renal cell cancer (RCC), transitional cell cancer (TCC), and Wilms' tumor. RCC makes up about 80% of kidney cancers, and TCC accounts for most of the rest. Risk factors for RCC and TCC include smoking, certain pain medications, previous bladder cancer, being overweight, high blood pressure, certain chemicals, and a family history. Risk factors for Wilms' tumor include a family history and certain genetic disorders such as WAGR syndrome. Diagnosis may be suspected based on symptoms, urine testing, and medical imaging. It is confirmed by tissue biopsy. b861216e15

Struvite Another image from the same urine sample as with Struvite (magnesium ammonium phosphate, sometimes abbreviated as MAP) is a phosphate mineral with formula: $\text{NH}_4\text{MgPO}_4 \cdot 6\text{H}_2\text{O}$. Struvite crystallizes in the orthorhombic system as white to yellowish or brownish-white pyramidal crystals or in platy mica-like forms. It is a soft mineral with Mohs hardness of 1. 7. 5 to 2 and has a low specific gravity of 1. It is

The external urethral sphincter is a striated muscle that allows voluntary control over urination.
