Yellow-wattled lapwing The four eggs typically The yellow-wattled lapwing (*Vanellus malabaricus*) is a lapwing that is endemic to the Indian subcontinent. Although they do not migrate, they are known to make seasonal movements in response to rains. The chicks are nidifugous, leaving the nest shortly after hatching and following their parents to forage for food. It is found mainly on the dry plains of peninsular India and has a sharp call and is capable of fast flight. Like other lapwings and plovers, they are ground birds and their nest is a mere collection of tiny pebbles within which their well camouflaged eggs are laid. They are dull grey brown with a black cap, yellow legs and a triangular wattle at the base of the beak. breast feathers ("belly soaking"; they may stay for as much as 10 minutes to soak water) which may then be used to cool the eggs or chicks
