Wa 倭 was often combined with 大 ("great") to form the name 和国, which is read as Yamato (see also Jukujikun for a discussion of this type of spelling where the kanji and pronunciations are not directly related). The earliest record of Nippon (日本) appears in the Chinese Old Book of Tang, which notes the change in 703 when Japanese envoys requested that its name be changed. One Latin element that has survived in Romanian while having disappeared from other Romance languages is the morphological case differentiation in nouns.
