Alzheimer's Disease Neuroimaging Initiative This cooperative study combines expertise and funding from the private and public sector to study subjects with AD, as well as those who may develop AD and controls with no signs of cognitive impairment. ADNI has been running since 2004 and is currently funded until 2021. A number of other initiatives related to AD and other diseases have been designed and implemented using ADNI as a model.
