== Description == Kamla Nehru Prani Sangrahalaya is one of the recognized zoos out of total 180 recognized zoos in India. Between 30-40 animals are born every year in the reserve. Animals have been exhibited at this location since 1933, when it was known as Jungleland Snake Farm. Owner Gordon Gaver operated the small attraction (approx. 5 acres) until his death in 1964. The facility was then purchased by Richard and Mary Anne Hahn and reopened in 1966. The Hahn family maintained ownership and gradually enlarged the park. In August 2012, the zoo was fined by the United States Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service \$12,000 for numerous violations. Purple-crowned fairywren Genetic evidence shows that the purple-crowned fairywren is most closely related to the superb fairywren and splendid fairywren. The species name is derived from the Latin word *cōrōna* meaning "crown", owing to the distinctive purple circle of crown feathers sported by breeding males. EcoFire is a landscape-scale fire management program of the central and The purple-crowned fairywren (*Malurus coronatus*) is a species of bird in the Australasian wren family, Maluridae. A femur that was forwarded to England, probably a dromornithid and since lost, suggested an Australian genus, but Owen withheld publication for many years. The type specimen, another femur, was found in a 55-metre-deep (180 ft) well at Peak Downs, Queensland, and subsequently described by Owen in 1872. Owen's new taxon was published in a series on... c9fc3773cf == Taxonomy == c9fc3773cf The scientific name *Dromornithidae* derives from the Greek words *δρομαίος*, *dromaios* ("swift-running") and *ὄρνις*, *ornis* ("bird"). The family was named by Max Fürbringer in 1888, citing W. B. Clarke and Gerard Krefft, Owen's separation from "*Dromaeus*" and *Dinornis*, and a note by von Haast allying *Dromornis* with *Dromaeus*. c9fc3773cf == Climate == c9fc3773cf At 10 to 13 cm (3.9 to 5.1 in) long and weighing 14 g (1/2 oz) the beautiful firetail is a small plump bird, slightly smaller than the diamond firetail. Its plumage is mostly olive-brown. The white chest has a fine pattern of dark lines. The head has a black mask with pale blue rings around the eyes and a thick red beak. Its rump is a deep red, its legs and feet are creamy pink. The wings and tail are short and rounded. Juvenile birds are less colourful with a smaller face mask and a blackish beak. The male has a black abdomen. c9fc3773cf The understanding of relationships within the paleognath clade has been in flux. Previously, all the flightless members had been assigned to the order Struthioniformes, which is more recently regarded as containing only the ostrich. The modern bird infraclass Palaeognathae consists of ratites and the flighted Neotropical tinamous (compare to Neognathae). Unlike other flightless birds, the ratites have no keel on their sternum—hence the name, from the Latin *rat*is ('raft', a vessel which has no keel—in contradistinction to extant flighted birds with a keel). Without this to anchor their wing muscles, they could not have flown even if they had developed suitable wings. Ratites are a polyphyletic group; tinamous fall within them, and are the sister group of the extinct moa. The organisms which herbivores consume are primary producers, predominantly plants (including algae). Herbivores which consume land plants may eat any or all of the fruit, leaves, sap, nectar, pollen, flowers, bark, cambium, underground storage organs like roots, tubers, and rhizomes, nuts, seeds, shoots, and other parts of plants; they frequently specialize in one or a few of these parts, though many herbivores also have quite diverse diets. c9fc3773cf

Dromornithidae One species, *Dromornis stirtoni*, was 3 m (9 ft 10 in) tall, making them among the largest birds ever. They were long classified in Struthioniformes (the ratites), but are now usually classified as a type of gigantic fowl (Galloanserae). It is now believed that the similarities between these groups *Dromornithidae*, known as mihirungs (after Tjapwuring Mihirung paringmal, "giant bird") and informally as thunder birds or demon ducks, is an extinct family of large, flightless birds native to Australia from at least the late Oligocene (and perhaps as early as the early Eocene) to the Late Pleistocene. They are thought to have been herbivorous. Only a single species, *Genyornis newtoni* survived into the Late Pleistocene. *Dromornithids* were part of the Australian megafauna. that dromornithids were related to ratites, such as emus, cassowaries, rheas and ostriches c9fc3773cf
