The third domain, Eukaryota, includes all multicellular organisms as well as many unicellular protists and protozoans that are microbes. Some protists are related to animals and some to green plants. Several countries regulate tampons as medical devices. In the United States, they are considered to be a Class II medical device by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Medical microbiologists often serve as consultants for physicians, providing identification of pathogens and suggesting treatment options. Microorganism In the 1880s, Robert Koch discovered that microorganisms caused the diseases tuberculosis, cholera, diphtheria, and anthrax. The possible existence of unseen microbial life was suspected from antiquity, with an early attestation in Jain literature authored in 6th-century BC India. In the 1850s, Louis Pasteur found that microorganisms caused food spoilage, debunking the theory of spontaneous generation. Microorganisms A microorganism, or microbe, is an organism of microscopic size, which may exist in its single-celled form or as a colony of cells. Some microorganisms that are seen to be beneficial to health are termed probiotics and are available as dietary supplements, or food additives. The scientific study of microorganisms began with their observation under the microscope in the 1670s by Anton van Leeuwenhoek 85f6ae19fc

Cat food As obligate carnivores, cats require animal-based proteins for essential nutrients such as taurine and arginine, which they cannot synthesize from plant-based sources. gut. In the 19th and early 20th centuries, cats in London were commonly fed horse meat sold by itinerant traders known as Cats' Meat Men or Women, who traveled fixed routes to serve households. Probiotics are considered a supplement rather than part of nutrition. French writers in the 1800s criticized this view, arguing that well-fed cats were more effective hunters. Therefore, there are no strict regulations to the amount of probiotics that Cat food is food specifically formulated for consumption by cats. By the late 19th century, commercial cat food emerged, with companies like Spratt's offering ready-made products to replace boiled horse meat. The idea

of specialized cat food developed later than dog food, as cats were long considered to be self-sufficient hunters 85f6ae19fc

In the United States, 90% of allergic responses to foods are caused by eight foods, including cow's milk. Recognition that a small number of foods are responsible for the majority of food allergies has led to requirements to prominently list these common allergens, including dairy, on food labels. One function of the immune system is to defend against infections by recognizing foreign proteins, but it should not overreact to food proteins. Heating milk proteins can cause them to become denatured, losing their three-dimensional configuration and allergenicity, so baked goods containing dairy products may be tolerated while fresh milk triggers an allergic reaction. 85f6ae19fc == Background == 85f6ae19fc The human body hosts many microorganisms, with approximately the same order of magnitude of non-human cells as human cells. Some microorganisms that humans host are commensal, meaning they co-exist without harming or benefiting humans; others have a mutualistic relationship with their human hosts, where both parties benefit. The first discovered probiotic was a certain strain of bacillus in Bulgarian yoghurt, called *Lactobacillus bulgaricus*. The discovery was made in 1905 by Bulgarian physician and microbiologist Stamen Grigorov.
