To meet the criteria for CKD, the abnormalities must be present for at least three months. At later stages, the symptoms may include leg swelling, feeling tired, vomiting, loss of appetite, and confusion. CKD can lead to end-stage kidney failure requiring kidney dialysis or kidney transplantation. Complications can relate to hormonal dysfunction of the kidneys and include high blood pressure (often related to activation of the renin-angiotensin system), insulin resistance, bone disease, and anemia. Additionally CKD patients have markedly increased cardiovascular complications with increased risks of death and hospitalization. Early in the course of CKD, patients are usually asymptomatic, but can be diagnosed via proteinuria 020473f045

Chronic kidney disease occurs in cats as a result of inflammation of the renal tubules and the renal interstitial tissue without an identifiable cause (idiopathic tubulointerstitial nephritis).
