Tornado outbreak of April 14–16, 2011 This was the largest number of fatalities in an outbreak in the United States since the 2008 Super Tuesday tornado outbreak. A total of 38 people were killed from tornadoes and an additional five people were killed as a result of straight-line winds associated with the storm system. S. S. Tornado outbreak of April 19-22, 2011 From April 19-22, a storm system moved through from the Great Plains to the eastern U. S. In the early hours of April 20, 2011, a tornado

tore through a neighborhood in Oregon, Ohio, leaving some significant damage but no injuries. Overnight, the squall line tracked eastward with widespread wind damage and many embedded tornadoes across several states, a few as strong as EF2, but most were brief and weak. From A major tornado outbreak affected the Midwestern and Southern United States from April 19-22, 2011, with 110 tornadoes being spawned across six days. 2011 The storm continued into the early hours of the morning causing more wind damage along the East Coast along with a few more tornadoes. The system From April 4-5, 2011, a large-scale damaging wind event and tornado outbreak affected the Southern and Eastern parts of the United States. Damaging tornadoes touched down in Arkansas, Kentucky, and Mississippi. Power outages were extensive across the area and tree damage was severe. Several people were killed and injured by falling trees and branches as the storm passed through. The system produced a large serial derecho windstorm that caused thousands of reports of wind damage and several embedded tornadoes. The outbreak was the first in a series of devastating tornado outbreaks in the month of April 2011, which would culminate near the end of the month with the largest tornado outbreak ever recorded. It is reportedly one of the most prolific damaging wind events on record. From April 4-5, 2011, a large-scale damaging wind event and tornado outbreak affected the Southern and Eastern parts of the United States

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The system brought a late-season snowstorm

to the Midwest and Northern Plains, and blizzard conditions to parts of South Dakota and northern Nebraska. With surface temperatures near freezing the snow was unusually wet for the region. This led for bad driving conditions on I-80 and I-90.

2011 Super Outbreak Other destructive tornadoes occurred in Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, New York, and Virginia, with storms also affecting other states in the Southern and Eastern United States. April 27 was the most active day, with a record 224 tornadoes touching down that day from midnight to midnight CDT (05:00-05:00 UTC). In total, 368 tornadoes were confirmed by NOAA's National Weather Service (NWS) and Government of Canada's Environment Canada in 21 states from Texas to New York to southern Canada.
