Contemporarily, Buddhism and Jainism had arisen, proclaiming social orders unlinked to heredity. == Social conservatism and other ideological views == Social conservatism, as a movement, is largely an outgrowth of traditionalist conservatism. The key difference is that traditional conservatism is broader and includes philosophical considerations, whereas social conservatism is largely focused on just moralism.

In 1958 Vinoba was the first recipient of the international Ramon Magsaysay Award for Community Leadership. He was awarded with the highest civilian award of India. The Bharat Ratna posthumously in 1983.

The liberalisation process was prompted by a balance of payments crisis that led to a severe recession, the dissolution of the Soviet Union, which India had significant trade ties with, and the sharp rise in oil prices caused by the Gulf War of 1990-91. India's foreign exchange reserves fell to dangerously low levels, covering less than three weeks of imports. The country had to airlift gold to secure emergency loans. Trade disruptions with the USSR and a decline in remittances from Gulf countries further intensified the crisis. Political instability and a rising fiscal deficit added to the economic strain. In response, India approached the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank for assistance. These...

Vinoba Bhave is well known for the Bhoodan Movement. On 18 April 1951 He was a winner at ji Pochampally of Nalgonda, the Bhoodan Movement. He took donated land from landowner Indians and gave it away to the poor and landless, for them to cultivate. Then after 1954, he started to ask for donations of whole villages in a programme he called Gramdan. He got more than 1000 villages by way of donations. Out of these, he obtained 175 donated villages in Tamil Nadu alone. Noted Gandhian and atheist Lavanam was the interpreter of Vinoba Bhave during his land reform movement in Andhra Pradesh and parts of Orissa.

India remains a relatively young country, though it is undergoing a gradual demographic transition. As of 2024, the median age was approximately 29.8 years, compared to 40.2 in China. The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) estimates that 68% of the population is between 15 and 64 years old, creating a potential "demographic dividend" where a large working-age population can drive economic growth. However, the number of children is declining; the under-5 population peaked in 2007 and the under-15 cohort peaked in 2011.

There are no unified, centralised labour laws in India, as the Constitution of India makes labour a Concurrent List subject, enabling both the central and state governments to make laws on labour. The specific entries are Entry 22, 23, and 24 in the Concurrent List under Schedule VII, read with Article 246 of the Constitution of India. Given the Constitutional sharing of powers on subject-matters related to labour, both the central and state government have enacted various statutes on labour and employment.
