Various taxonomic families of land slugs form part of several quite different evolutionary lineages, which also include snails. Thus, the various families of slugs are not closely related, despite the superficial similarity in overall body form. The shell-less condition has arisen many times independently as an example of convergent evolution, and thus the category "slug" is polyphyletic. == Description == The northern caiman lizard is built similarly to its cousin the tegu, with a large heavy set body and short but powerful limbs. Its head is bulky and often a red or orange color. Their jaws are heavily muscular to help aid in eating its normal prey of snails, crawfish and fresh water clams. It also has a few adaptations that help it in its watery habitat. It has a long and flattened tail, similar to its namesake, the caiman. The long tail helps the northern caiman lizard to successfully swim and dive. A clear third eyelid is thought to act like a pair of goggles underwater. Commercial snail farming in the Western world typically utilizes snails in the family Helicidae, particularly *Cornu aspersum* (morphotypically divided into *C. a. aspersa* and *C. a. maxima*), formerly known as *Helix aspersa*. In tropical climates, snail farming is typically done with the African snail. Snail meat from the African snail is highly valued and widely consumed. The term 'heliculture' is used for raising snails for any commercial purpose, but generally refers to farming snails for escargot and cosmetic applications. It can also refer to cultivation of sea snails, such as whelks. == Thesis == As of 2014, cone snails are the only member of the superfamily Conoidea. Some

previous classifications grouped the cone snails in a subfamily, Coninae. As of March 2015 Conidae contained over 800 recognized species, varying widely in size from lengths of 1.3 cm to 21.6 cm. Working in 18th-century Europe, Carl Linnaeus knew of only 30 species that are still considered valid.

Heliciculture known as snail farming, is the process of raising edible land snails, primarily for human consumption or cosmetic use. The snails are collected after the rains and are put to "purge" (fasting). In the past, the consumption of snails had a marked seasonality, from April to June. Now, snail-breeding techniques make them available all year. Heliciculture occurs mainly in Spain, France, and Italy, which are also the countries with the greatest culinary tradition of the snail. Although throughout history the snail has had little value in the kitchen because it is considered "poverty food", in recent times it can be classified as a delicacy thanks to the appreciation given to it by haute cuisine chefs.

It was first described by William Lucas Distant in 1887. Their colour varies, but is normally red to green; they have a scimitar-shaped process on their heads. They feed on the sap of trees, most commonly Simarouba amara, and they excrete honeydew out of their anuses.

Nagel asserts that "an organism has conscious mental states if and only if there is something that it is like to be that organism—something it is like for the organism." This assertion has achieved special status in consciousness studies as "the standard 'what it's like' locution". Daniel Dennett, while sharply disagreeing on some points, acknowledged Nagel's paper as "the most widely cited and influential thought experiment about consciousness".

Scotch bonnet (sea snail) The Scotch bonnet (*Semicassis granulata*) is a medium-sized to large species of sea snail, a marine gastropod mollusk in the subfamily Cassinae, the helmet shells and bonnet shells. The surface sculpture of the shell is highly variable: the surface can be smooth and polished, have grooves, be granulated, or even be nodulose on the shoulder of the whorls. The common name "Scotch bonnet" alludes to the general outline and color pattern of the shell, which vaguely resemble a tam o' shanter, a traditional Scottish bonnet or cap. The shell is egg-shaped and fairly large, 2 to 4 inches (5 to 10 cm) in maximum dimension, with a regular pattern of yellow, orange or brown squarish spots.

Cone snail venoms are mainly... Perhaps the best-known edible land snail species in the Western world is *Helix pomatia*, commonly known as the Roman snail or the Burgundy snail. This species, however, is not fit for profitable snail farming, and is normally harvested from nature. This species lives intertidally and subtidally on sandy substrates, and is found primarily in the tropical and subtropical Western Atlantic Ocean, from North Carolina to Uruguay. It is the most common species in this subfamily in North America. A similar-appearing sea snail in the Mediterranean Sea and Northern Atlantic Ocean, *Semicassis undulata*, is currently considered to be a separate species. The exact taxonomy of *Semicassis granulata* has been unclear in the past: as well as the current combination, 38 other... Several other animals feed on this honeydew, having what is termed a trophobiotic relationship with this species of bug. An air-breathing land snail, *Pittieria aurantiaca* feeds on the honeydew, and this relationship is the first observed biotrophic interaction between an insect and a gastropod. Cockroaches have been observed to feed on a wax that covers the wing cases of this lantern bug, and this was the first observed biotrophic interaction involving a cockroach. Heterophyes heterophyes Mammals that come in contact with the parasite are dogs, humans, and cats. Humans and mammals will come in contact with this parasite by the consumption of contaminated or raw fish. H. It can cause an intestinal infection called heterophyiasis. Humans and other mammals are the definitive hosts, first intermediate hosts are snails, and second intermediate are fish. This parasite is one of the smallest endoparasites to infect humans. For transmission to occur from snails to fish the snails had Heterophyes heterophyes, or the intestinal fish fluke, is a species of digenean flatworm that was discovered by Theodor Maximilian Bilharz in 1851. Fish that come in contact with this parasite include Mugil cephalus, Tilapia nilotica, Aphanus fasciatus, and Acanthogobius sp. They use different species to complete their complex lifestyle. This parasite was found during an autopsy of an Egyptian mummy. a snail, to fish which live in Northern Africa in lagoons that are connected to the sea. heterophyes is found in the Middle East, West Europe and Africa. Of the six orders of Pulmonata, two - the Onchidiacea and Soleolifera - solely comprise slugs.
