Gwion Gwion rock paintings The art consists primarily of human figures ornamented with accessories such as bags, tassels and headdresses. A 2020 study estimates that most of the anthropomorphic figures were created 12,000 years ago, based on analysis of painted-over wasps' nests. However the identity of the artists and the age of the art are contested within archaeology and amongst Australian rock art researchers. These aspects have been debated since the works were seen, and recorded, in 1891 by pastoralist Joseph Bradshaw, after whom they were named until recent decades. As the Kimberley is home to many traditional owners, the rock art is referred to and known by many different names in the local languages, the most common of which are Gwion Gwion or Kiro Kiro/Giro Giro. Key traditional owners have published their own account of the meaning of the images.
