It is categorized as "macular perifoveal telangiectasia", a neurodegenerative metabolic disorder, correlated with diabetes and coronary artery disease. It generally affects both eyes and usually affects both sexes equally. 2cd78bd2cd Corneal neovascularization is a sight-threatening condition that can be caused by inflammation related to infection, chemical injury, autoimmune conditions, immune hypersensitivity, post-corneal transplantation, and traumatic conditions among other ocular pathologies. Common causes of CNV within the cornea include trachoma, corneal ulcers, phlyctenular keratoconjunctivitis, rosacea keratitis, interstitial keratitis, sclerosing keratitis, chemical burns, and wearing contact lenses for over-extended periods of time. Often, they are performed in surgical suites or in professional medical centers. Since the procedure can typically remove the top to deeper layers of the epidermis and extend into the reticular dermis, there is always minor skin bleeding. The procedure carries risks of scarring, skin discoloration, infections and facial herpes virus (cold sore) reactivation. Over time, metabolic changes of the crystalline lens fibres lead to the development of a cataract, causing impairment or loss of vision. Some infants are born with congenital cataracts, and environmental factors may lead to cataract formation. Early symptoms may include glare from lights, especially at night, blunting of colors in vision and reduced visual acuity at low light levels. 2cd78bd2cd Many people often do not have symptoms until very late in their disease course. Patients often become symptomatic when there is irreversible damage. Symptoms are usually not painful and can include: 2cd78bd2cd The cause is not fully understood but likely involves a combination of genetic, environmental, and hormonal factors. Having a parent, sibling, or child with keratoconus increases risk significantly. Environmental risk factors include frequent eye rubbing and allergies. Diagnosis is typically made with corneal topography, which maps the shape of the cornea and reveals characteristic changes. 2cd78bd2cd

Keratoconus Both eyes are usually affected. This causes distorted vision, including blurry vision, double vision, increased nearsightedness, irregular astigmatism, and light sensitivity, which can reduce quality of life. Usually, laser ablation refers to removing material with a pulsed laser, but it is possible to ablate material with a continuous wave laser beam if the laser intensity is high enough. While relatively long laser pulses (e.g. nanosecond pulses) can heat and thermally alter or damage the processed material, ultrashort laser pulses (e.g. femtoseconds) cause only minimal material damage during processing due to the ultrashort light-matter interaction and are therefore also suitable for micromaterial processing. 2cd78bd2cd Type 1, a very rare disease involving microaneurysms in the retina, typically affects a single eye in male patients, and it may be associated with Coats' disease. 2cd78bd2cd There are a variety of characteristics which indicate that an individual may have phacolytic glaucoma. Within older people, the lens of the eye may appear to be yellow and lose its transparency (becomes cloudy). Once the protein begins to seep into the lens, permanent damage to the lens may be caused as the precipitate in lens impairs vision. 2cd78bd2cd Excimer lasers of deep ultra-violet light are mainly used in photoablation; the wavelength of laser used in photoablation is approximately 200 nm. 2cd78bd2cd

Retinopathy, or retinal vascular disease, can be broadly categorized into proliferative and non-proliferative types. Diabetic retinopathy is the leading cause of blindness in working-aged people. to the retina. Frequently, retinopathy is an ocular manifestation of systemic disease as seen in diabetes or hypertension. Retinopathy often refers to retinal vascular disease, or damage to the retina caused by abnormal blood flow. Age-related macular degeneration is technically included under the umbrella term retinopathy but is often discussed as a separate entity. It accounts for about 5% of blindness worldwide and is designated a priority eye disease by the World Health Organization. Diabetic retinopathy affects up to 80 percent of those who have had both type 1 and type 2 diabetes for 20 years or more. In at least 90% of new cases, progression to more aggressive forms of sight-threatening retinopathy and maculopathy could be reduced with proper treatment and monitoring of the eyes. The longer a person has diabetes, the higher their chances of developing diabetic retinopathy. Each year in the United States, diabetic retinopathy accounts for 12% of all new cases of blindness. It is also the leading cause of blindness in people aged 20 to 64. 2cd78bd2cd

Macular telangiectasia Treatment options for Type 1 include laser photocoagulation, intravitreal injections of steroids Macular telangiectasia is a condition of the retina, the light-sensing tissue at the back of the eye that causes gradual deterioration of central vision, interfering with tasks such as reading and driving. type 1 has been called as a variant of Coats's disease 2cd78bd2cd

In early stages, vision is often corrected with glasses or soft contact lenses. As the condition progresses, rigid or scleral contact lenses may be needed. In 2016, the FDA approved corneal collagen cross-linking to halt progression. Dermabrasion Ocular injury may occur if crystals are inadvertently sprayed in the eye or if crystals remain around the eye and cause a corneal Dermabrasion is a type of surgical skin planing, generally with the goal of removing acne scarring and other skin or tissue irregularities, typically performed in a professional medical setting by a dermatologist or plastic surgeon trained specifically in this procedure. operator doing the treatment. Dermabrasion has been practiced for many years (before the advent of lasers) and involves the controlled deeper abrasion (wearing away) of the upper to mid layers of the skin with any variety of strong abrasive devices including a wire brush, diamond wheel or fraise, sterilized sandpaper, salt crystals or other mechanical means 2cd78bd2cd

The main symptoms of glaucoma include pain in the eye, redness and loss of sight, all of which reduce an individual's independence, in turn, reducing quality of life and an individual's ability to fulfill other societal roles (such as driving and reading) as it reduces visual clarity. Phacolysis tends to be more frequently reported in underdeveloped countries because of the lack of resources necessary to treat such as condition. 2cd78bd2cd During cataract surgery, the cloudy natural lens is removed from the posterior chamber of the eye, either by emulsification in place or by manual removal. An IOL (intraocular lens) is usually implanted in its place (PCIOL), or less frequently in the ciliary sulcus, to restore clear vision. Cataract surgery is performed by an ophthalmologist in an out-patient setting at a surgical centre or hospital. Local anaesthesia (injection) or topical anesthesia (drops) are normally used. Corneal neovascularization Maintaining avascularity of the corneal stroma is an important aspect of healthy corneal physiology as it is required for corneal transparency and optimal vision. Corneal tissue is avascular in nature and the presence of vascularization, which can be deep or superficial, is always pathologically related. however, this treatment has limited clinical acceptance due to high costs and many potential complications involved that are also related to laser ablation Corneal neovascularization (CNV) is the in-growth of new blood vessels from the pericorneal plexus into avascular corneal tissue as a result of oxygen deprivation. A decrease in corneal transparency causes visual acuity deterioration 2cd78bd2cd

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
