2020 United States presidential election in Georgia Georgia has 16 electoral votes in the Electoral College. Georgia voters chose electors to represent them in the Electoral College via a popular vote, pitting the Republican Party's nominee, incumbent President Donald Trump of Florida, and running mate Vice President Mike Pence of Indiana against Democratic Party nominee, former Vice President Joe Biden of Delaware, and his running mate Senator Kamala Harris of California. The town of Powder Springs was incorporated as Springville in 1838 in the lands of two Cherokee leaders. It is Georgia's dominant religious institution, and a majority of Georgian people are members. The church is headed by the patriarch of All Georgia, Shio III, who was elected in 2026. As in similar autocephalous Eastern Orthodox Christian churches, the church's highest governing body is the holy synod of bishops. On September 21, 2009, Douglas County was devastated by the second worst flood in Georgia history (the first being the failure of the Kelly Barnes Dam in 1977). Over 18 inches (457 mm) of rain fell in

one night, destroying many roads and homes. The county was later declared a disaster area, and the governor of Georgia declared a state of emergency. The flooding most affected the areas of Douglasville, Villa Rica, Austell, Lithia Springs, and Chapel Hill.
