

Control Keys In Computer

On many keyboard layouts, characters that typically require the use of the Shift key include the parentheses, the question mark, the exclamation point, and the colon. For example, in most keyboard layouts the Shift key combination ↑ Shift+A will produce a capital letter "A" instead of the default lower-case letter "a" (unless in Caps Lock or Shift lock mode). A combination of Alt+F4 in Microsoft Windows will trigger the shortcut for closing the active window; in this instance, Alt is the modifier key. In contrast, pressing just ↑ Shift or Alt will probably do nothing unless assigned a specific function in a particular program (for example, activating input aids or the toolbar of the active window in Windows). Modifier key In general, pressing a modifier key on its own does nothing; therefore pressing any of the ↑ Shift, Alt, or Ctrl keys alone will not usually trigger computer action.
