" Thus, Vachanamrut The Vachanamrut (IAST: Vacanāmṛta, lit. Compiled by five of his senior disciples, Swaminarayan edited and approved the scripture. As followers believe Swaminarayan to be Parabrahman, or God, the Vachanamrut is considered a direct revelation from God and thus a theological essence and the most precise interpretation of the Upanishads, Bhagavad Gita, and other important Hindu scriptures 8ead32bb04
