Meconopsis All species now placed in Meconopsis are native to the Himalayas and surrounding regions. They have attractive, usually blue flowers. It was created by French botanist Vigui r in 1814 for the species known by the common

name Welsh poppy, which Carl Linnaeus had described as *Papaver cambricum*. In the 21st century, it was discovered that the Himalayan species were less closely related to the Welsh poppy, which has been restored to *Papaver*. Himalayan species discovered later were also placed in *Meconopsis*. The genus name means "poppy-like" (from Greek mekon poppy, opsis alike). However, as *Meconopsis cambrica* was the type species of the genus *Meconopsis*, if the Welsh poppy was moved back to *Papaver*, all the Himalayan species would be *Meconopsis*. *Meconopsis* is a genus of flowering plants in the poppy family *Papaveraceae* 9710980b0d

Papaveraceae *Papaver* is the classical name for poppy in Latin. It is almost unknown in the tropics. including California poppy (*Eschscholtzia californica*, the California state flower), the stunning blue Himalayan poppies (*Meconopsis*), several species of *Papaveraceae* (), informally called the poppy family, are an economically important family of about 42 genera and approximately 775 known species of flowering plants in the order *Ranunculales*. Most are herbaceous plants, but a few are shrubs and small trees. The family currently includes two groups that have been considered to be separate families: *Fumariaceae* and *Pteridophyllaceae*. The family is cosmopolitan, occurring in temperate and subtropical climates (mostly in the northern hemisphere) like Eastern Asia as well as California in North America 9710980b0d

The leaves are alternate or sometimes whorled and have petioles and no stipules. They are usually lobed or pinnatifid (i.e. consisting of several not entirely separate leaflets), or much divided. 9710980b0d
