Vein action of breathing during respiration. Most veins carry deoxygenated blood from the tissues back to the heart; exceptions are those of the pulmonary and fetal circulations which carry oxygenated blood to the heart. In the systemic circulation, arteries carry oxygenated blood away from the heart, and veins return deoxygenated blood to the heart, in the deep veins. Standing or sitting for a prolonged period of time can cause low venous return from venous pooling (vascular) shock A vein () is a blood vessel in the circulatory system of humans and most other animals that carries blood towards the heart

Veins have less smooth muscle and connective tissue and wider internal diameters than arteries. Because of their thinner walls and wider lumens they are able to expand and hold more blood. This greater capacity gives them the term of capacitance vessels. At any time, nearly 70% of the total volume of blood in the human body is in the veins. In medium and large sized veins the flow of blood is maintained by one-way (unidirectional) venous valves to prevent backflow. In the lower limbs...

== Traditional postpartum care == Many traditional forms of postpartum confinement exist throughout the world. A 2007 qualitative systematic review examining practices across more than 20 countries found common themes including organized support for the new mother, prescribed periods of rest, specific dietary practices, hygiene rituals, and infant care guidance — allowing the mother to be "mothered" during recovery. Chinese Zuo Yuezi (sitting the month), European Lying-in, Korean Sanhujori, Japanese satogaeri bunben (returning to the natal home), and Latin American cuarentena are well-documented examples. There are three sizes of veins: large, medium, and small. Smaller veins are called venules, the smallest of which are called post-capillary venules – microscopic veins that play a major role in microcirculation. Veins are often closer to the skin than arteries. Cerebral palsy is caused by abnormal development or damage to the parts of the brain that control movement, balance, and posture. Most often, the problems occur during pregnancy, but may occur during childbirth or shortly afterwards. Oftentimes the brain will be damaged during prenatal neurodevelopment, and many times the cause is unknown. Risk factors include preterm birth, being a twin, certain infections or exposure to methylmercury during pregnancy, a difficult delivery, and head trauma during the first few years of life. A study published in 2024 suggests that inherited genetic causes play a role in 25% of cases, where... Common side effects include sleepiness, dry mouth, constipation, nausea, and blurry vision. Serious side effects may include increased risk of suicide in those under the age of 25, mania, and urinary retention. A withdrawal syndrome may occur if the dose is rapidly decreased. Use during pregnancy and breastfeeding is not generally recommended. Although how it works for treating depression remains an area of active inquiry, it may involve increasing the levels of norepinephrine, along with blocking histamine, acetylcholine, and serotonin.

Postpartum period (Maternity hospitals used to use this phrase, as in the General Lying-in Hospital The postpartum (or postnatal) period begins after childbirth and is typically considered to last for six to eight weeks. During the delayed phase, some changes to the genitourinary system take much longer to resolve and may result in conditions such as urinary incontinence. Most maternal and newborn deaths occur during this period. known as "lying-in", which, as the term suggests, centres around bed rest. The World Health Organization (WHO) describes the postnatal period as the most critical and yet the most neglected phase in the lives of mothers and babies. There are three distinct phases of the postnatal period; the acute phase, lasting for six to twelve hours after birth; the subacute phase, lasting six weeks; and the delayed phase, lasting up to six months 7c3c0dcaba

ABC transporter Evidence The ABC transporters, also known as ATP-binding cassette transporters, are a transport system superfamily that is one of the largest and possibly one of the oldest gene families. ABC transporters belong to translocases. ABC-transporters have been shown to exist within the placenta, indicating they could play a protective role for the developing fetus against xenobiotics. It is represented in all extant phyla, from prokaryotes to humans 7c3c0dcaba

It draws on principles that emphasize activities and... 7c3c0dcaba The dromedary feeds on foliage and desert vegetation; several adaptations, such as the ability to tolerate losing more than 30% of its total water content, allow it to thrive in its desert habitat. Mating occurs annually and peaks in the rainy season; females bear a single calf after a gestation of 15 months.
