

What Is A Moon Phases

== Phenomena == The appearance of the Moon (its phase) depends on the observer's latitude and is opposite across northern hemisphere and southern hemisphere observers. It gradually changes over a lunar month as the relative orbital positions of the Moon around Earth, and Earth around the Sun, shift. The visible side of the Moon is sunlit to varying extents, depending on the position of the Moon in its orbit, with the sunlit portion varying from 0% (at new moon) to nearly 100% (at full moon).

The ancient Greek philosopher Anaxagoras noted that "the sun provides the moon with its brightness". Ancient Chinese polymath Zhang Heng concluded that the light of the Moon comes from the Sun. He writes in his treatise, *The Spiritual Constitution of the Universe*, that the Sun and Moon are "like fire and water", where the Sun "gives out light", and the Moon "reflects it".

Human exploration of the Moon since *Luna 2* has consisted of both crewed and uncrewed missions. NASA's Apollo program has been the only program to successfully land humans on the Moon, which it did six times on the near side in the late 20th century. The first human landing took place in 1969, when the Apollo 11 astronauts Buzz Aldrin and Neil Armstrong touched down on the surface in the region of Mare Tranquillitatis, leaving scientific instruments upon the mission's completion and returning lunar samples to Earth. The time interval between a full moon and the next repetition of the same phase, a synodic month, averages about 29.53 days. Because of irregularities in the moon's orbit, the new and full moons may fall up to thirteen hours either side of their mean. If the calendar date is not locally determined through observation of the new moon at the beginning of the month there is the potential for a further twelve hours difference depending on the time zone. Potential discrepancies also arise from whether the calendar day is considered to begin in the evening or at midnight. It is normal for the full moon to fall on the fourteenth or the fifteenth of the month according to whether the start of the month is reckoned from the appearance of the new moon or from the conjunction. A typical viewing phenomenon is the perceived change of apparent size. While appearing slightly smaller near the horizon, the Moon is perceived larger near the horizon, called the Moon illusion. Culturally and spiritually... In geophysical terms, the Moon is a planetary-mass object or satellite planet. Its mass is 1.2% that of the Earth, and its diameter is 3,474 km (2,159 mi), roughly one-quarter of Earth's (about as wide as the contiguous United States). Within the Solar System, it is larger and more massive than any known dwarf planet, and the fifth-largest and fifth-most massive moon, as well as the largest and most massive in relation to its parent planet. Moon This tidal locking effectively synchronizes the Moon's rotation period (lunar day) to its orbital period (lunar month). The Moon and Earth are bound by gravitational attraction, which is stronger on the sides facing each other. It orbits around Earth at an average distance of 384,399 kilometers (238,854 mi), a distance roughly 30 times the width of Earth. The resulting tidal forces are the main driver of Earth's tides, and have pulled the Moon to always face Earth with the same near side. It completes an orbit (lunar month) in relation to Earth and the Sun (synodically) every 29. Full moon There are eight phases of the moon, which vary from partial to full illumination. The moon phases are also called lunar phases. This occurs when Earth is located between the Sun and the Moon (when the ecliptic longitudes of the Sun and Moon differ by 180°). stars. The full moon occurs roughly once a month. This means that the lunar hemisphere facing Earth—the near side—is completely sunlit and appears as an approximately circular disk. In common usage, the four major phases are the new moon, the first quarter, the full moon, and the last quarter. Because the Moon is tidally locked to Earth, the cycle of phases takes one lunar month and moves across the same side of the Moon, which always faces Earth. A lunar month is the time between successive recurrences of the same phase: due to the eccentricity of the Moon's orbit, this duration is not perfectly constant but averages about 29.
