A noun, consensus can represent a generally accepted opinion - "general agreement or concord; harmony", "a majority of opinion" - or the outcome of a consensus decision-making process. The decision is then no longer attributable to any single individual who is a member of the group. In workplace settings, collaborative decision-making is one of the most successful models to generate buy-in from other stakeholders, build consensus, and encourage creativity. In this vein, certain collaborative arrangements have the potential to generate better net performance outcomes than individuals acting on their own. According to the idea of synergy, decisions made collectively also tend to be more effective than decisions made by a single individual. Excepting very simple situations, successful action axioms are used in an iterative manner. The increasing use of automated decision-making systems (ADMS) across a range of contexts presents many benefits and challenges to human society requiring consideration of the technical, legal, ethical, societal, educational, economic and health consequences. ADM may involve large-scale data from a range of sources, such as databases, text, social media, sensors, images or speech, that is processed using various technologies including computer software, algorithms, machine learning, natural language processing, artificial intelligence, augmented intelligence and robotics. In contrast to SDM, the traditional biomedical care system placed physicians in a position of authority with patients playing a passive role in care. Physicians

In the 18th century, Daniel Bernoulli Decision theory or the theory of rational choice is a branch of probability, economics, and analytic philosophy that uses expected utility and probability to model how individuals would behave rationally under uncertainty.
