Areas in the Eastern Time Zone which do not observe daylight saving time use Eastern Standard Time, which is based on the 75th meridian west of Greenwich. Observation of daylight saving time starts on the second Sunday in March; at 2:00 a.m. EST, clocks are advanced to 3:00 a.m. EDT, creating a 23-hour day. The offsets range from UTC−12:00 to UTC+14:00, and are usually a whole number of hours, but a few zones are offset by an additional 30 or 45 minutes, such as in India and Nepal. Some areas in a time zone may use a different offset for part of the year, typically one hour ahead during spring and summer, a practice known as daylight saving time (DST). 6f8c7a2e20 == Regions using Central Time (CT) == 6f8c7a2e20 Daylight saving time (DST) is observed in most parts of that zone (20 states in the US, three provinces or territories in Canada, and several border municipalities in Mexico): Central Standard Time (CST) is observed from the first Sunday in November to the second Sunday in March. It is six hours behind Coordinated Universal Time (UTC) and designated internationally as UTC−6. From the second Sunday in March to the first Sunday in November, the same areas observe DST, creating the designation of Central Daylight Time (CDT), which is five hours behind UTC and known formally as UTC−5. 6f8c7a2e20

The clocks run by these services are kept synchronized with each other as well as with those of other international timekeeping organizations. Official and highly precise timekeeping services (clocks) are provided by two federal agencies: the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) (an agency of the Department of Commerce); and the United States Naval Observatory (USNO) 6f8c7a2e20

Soil runoff and leached nitrate, exacerbated by agricultural Dead zones are hypoxic (low-oxygen) areas in the world's oceans and large lakes. 5 mg O₂/liter in a body of water, mass mortality occurs. Historically, many of these sites were naturally occurring. Hypoxia occurs when dissolved oxygen (DO) concentration falls to or below 2 mg of O₂/liter. These occur near inhabited coastlines, where aquatic life is most concentrated. However, in the 1970s, oceanographers began noting increased instances and expanses of dead zones. With such a low concentration of DO, these bodies of water fail to support the aquatic life living there. Once DO declines below 0

Originally a mining town named Jarilla Junction due to its proximity to the Jarilla Mountains, established in 1905, the town was renamed Orogrande (Spanish for big gold) in 1906 and is not far from similar mining towns (now completely abandoned ghost towns) named Brice and Ohaysi. The population soared to approximately 2000 as the result of a gold rush that occurred in 1905, but quickly collapsed almost to the point of depopulation when the gold deposits proved much less abundant than expected. There are still numerous abandoned mines in the area which fall under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management. Other land around Orogrande is part of a military reservation under the control of Fort Bliss.

Some municipalities near the U.S. border, as well as the entire state of Baja California, observe daylight saving time, setting the time forward one hour on the second Sunday of March at 2:00 and back one hour on the first Sunday of November at 2:00. This is done to maintain the same time as the respective areas across the border in the United States.

The Canadian province of British Columbia and Yukon Territory observe permanent daylight saving time in the Pacific Time Zone, which is equivalent to year-round Mountain Standard Time. 6f8c7a2e20 Coastal regions, such as the Baltic Sea, the northern Gulf of Mexico, and the Chesapeake Bay, as well as large enclosed water bodies like Lake Erie, have been affected by deoxygenation due to eutrophication.
