Water molecules form hydrogen bonds with each
other and are strongly polar. This polarity allows
them to dissociate ions in salts and bond to other
polar substances such as alcohols and acids, thus
dissolving them. Their hydrogen bonding causes
their many unique properties, such as having a solid
form less dense than its liquid form, a relatively high
boiling point of 100 °C for its molar mass, and a high
