Feminist rhetoric These set of tactics aim to counter traditional forms of rhetoric, favoring dialogue over monologue. Feminist rhetoric does not focus exclusively on the rhetoric of women or feminists but instead prioritizes the feminist principles of inclusivity, community, and equality over the classic, patriarchal model of persuasion that ultimately separates people from their own experience. Seen as the act of producing or the study of feminist discourses, feminist rhetoric emphasizes and supports the lived experiences and histories of all human beings in all manner of experiences. It also redefines traditional delivery sites to include non-traditional locations such as demonstrations, letter writing, and digital processes, and alternative practices such as rhetorical listening and productive silence. It emphasizes the narratives of all demographics, including women and other marginalized groups, into the consideration or practice of rhetoric. Rhetorical feminism is as a set of strategies that expand who can speak, who counts as audience, and how audiences can respond. over monologue and seeking to redefine the way audiences view rhetorical appeals. Speakers use inventio when they begin the thought process of forming and developing an effective argument. Often, the invention phase can be seen as the first step in an attempt to generate ideas or create an argument that is convincing and compelling. The other four canons of classical rhetoric (namely dispositio, elocutio, memoria, and pronuntiatio) rely on their interrelationship with invention. 273e7c6e41 Actio - canon #5 in Cicero's list of rhetorical canons; traditionally linked to oral rhetoric, referring to how a speech is given (including tone of voice and nonverbal gestures, among others). 273e7c6e41 Aristotle defined rhetoric as "the faculty of observing in any given case the available means of persuasion", and since mastery of the art was

necessary for victory in a case at law, for passage of proposals in the assembly, or for fame as a speaker in civic ceremonies, he called it "a combination of the science of logic and of the ethical branch of politics". Aristotle also identified three persuasive audience appeals: logos, pathos, and ethos. The five canons of rhetoric, or phases of developing a persuasive speech, were first codified in classical Rome: invention, arrangement, style, memory, and delivery. 273e7c6e41 Accumulatio - the emphasis or summary of previously made points or inferences by excessive praise or accusation. 273e7c6e41 == Lyrics == 273e7c6e41 It involves choices in tone, style, and language to persuade, inform, entertain, or engage the audience. Rhetorical stance can include elements such as the use of ethos (establishing credibility), pathos (appealing to emotions), and logos (logical reasoning) to shape the overall impact of a communication. 273e7c6e41 After political scientists introduced this theory in 1981, Jeffrey K. Tulis authored *The Rhetorical Presidency* in 1987 establishing itself as the first book on the theory. Tulis established three stages in his book how presidential rhetoric evolved throughout the U.S.' history: the "Old Way", the "Middle Way" and the "New Way". Tulis's book sparked much debate over the historical evolution of presidential rhetoric. Within the realm of rhetorical composition, the persona, audience, and contextual factors form the foundation of persuasive rhetoric. 273e7c6e41 *Art, Argument, and Advocacy* (2002) argued that the appeal substitutes emotion for reason in debate. Ethicist Jack Marshall wrote in 2005 that the phrase's popularity stems from its capacity to stunt rationality, particularly discourse on morals. "Think of the children" has been invoked by censorship proponents to shield children from perceived danger. *Community, Space and Online Censorship* (2009) argued that classifying children in an infantile manner, as innocents in need of protection, is a form of obsession over the concept of purity. A 2011 article in the *Journal for Cultural Research* observed that the phrase grew out of a moral panic. 273e7c6e41 Ad hominem - rebutting an argument by attacking the character, motive, or other attribute of the person making it rather than the substance of the argument itself. 273e7c6e41

Inventio measured purely on the brilliance of his rhetorical skills. This aspect of rhetoric is one reason why Plato attacked what he saw as empty rhetoric on the part of his contemporaries. Inventio, one of the five canons of rhetoric, is the method used for the discovery of arguments in Western rhetoric and comes from the Latin word, meaning "invention" or "discovery". Inventio is the central, indispensable canon of rhetoric, and traditionally means a systematic search for arguments 273e7c6e41

Modes of persuasion Other factors Aristotle requires of strong rhetorical speakers are wisdom, virtue, and goodwill to better persuade their audience. Often, the modes of persuasion are directly equated with these three traditional rhetorical appeals: ethos, pathos, and logos—an appeal to the presenter's credibility, an appeal to audience emotions, and an appeal to reasoning or logic, respectively—all three of which appear in Aristotle's Rhetoric. There is also a less well-known fourth term, kairos (Ancient Greek: καίρος): appealing to the timeliness, or meaningfulness of the timing, of the presentation. persuasion, modes of appeal, or rhetorical appeals (Greek: pisteis) are

An appeal to nature is a rhetorical technique for presenting and proposing the argument that "a thing is good because it is 'natural', or bad because it is 'unnatural' or 'synthetic' 273e7c6e41
