

Allergic Reaction To Bites And Stings

An insect sting is complicated by its introduction of venom, although not all stings are venomous. Bites, which can introduce saliva as well as additional pathogens and diseases, are often confused with stings, and vice versa. Specific components of venom are believed to give rise to an allergic reaction, which in turn produces skin lesions that may vary from a small itching weal, or slightly elevated area of the skin, to large areas of inflamed skin covered by vesicles and crusted lesions.

It typically causes more than one of the following: an itchy rash, throat closing due to swelling that can obstruct or stop breathing; severe tongue swelling that can also interfere with or stop breathing; shortness of breath, vomiting, lightheadedness, loss of consciousness, low blood pressure, and medical shock. Of all extant ant species, about 71% are considered to be stinging species. Notable examples include a few species of medical importance, such as *Solenopsis* (fire ants), *Pachycondyla*, *Myrmecia* (bulldog ants), and *Paraponera* (bullet ants). In the case of fire ants, the venom consists mainly of alkaloid (>95%) and protein (<1%) components. Stinging ants cause a cutaneous condition that is different from that caused by biting venomous ants. Particularly painful are stings from fire ants, although the bullet ant's sting is considered by some to be the most painful insect sting. Some subfamilies have evolutionarily lost the ability to sting.

Ant venom Severe allergic reactions can be caused by ant stings in particular and venomous stings in general, including severe chest Ant venom is any of, or a mixture of, irritants and toxins inflicted by ants. zinc oxide or calamine lotion. Most ants spray or inject a venom, the main constituent of which is formic acid only in the case of subfamily Formicinae

Stinging insects produce a painful swelling of the skin, the severity of the lesion varying according to the location of the sting, the identity of the insect and the sensitivity of the subject. Many species of bees and wasps have two poison glands, one gland secreting a toxin in which formic acid is one recognized constituent, and the other secreting an alkaline neurotoxin; acting independently, each toxin is rather mild, but when they combine through the sting, the combination has strong irritating properties... Symptoms which are most likely to develop include: Keratinocytes, which form the outer layer of the skin, not only act as a physical barrier but also release a protein called thymic stromal lymphopoietin. This protein activates T-cells to produce cytokines, which are known to be involved in allergic skin reactions. == Honey bee stings == Mosquito allergy may result in a collection of symptoms called skeeter syndrome that occur after a bite. This syndrome may be mistaken for an infection such as cellulitis. In anaphylactic patients the response is more aggressive leading to a systemic reaction where the response progresses from the sting site around the whole...

Animal bite The contusions can occur without a break in the skin. An animal bite usually results in a break in the skin but also includes contusions from the excessive pressure on body tissue from the bite. == Ant stings == Dendritic cells, a type of immune cell, capture and present antigens (foreign substances) to T-cells, or they migrate to lymph nodes to initiate immune responses. They contribute to the immune response to jellyfish venom and its components through various receptors involved in recognizing pathogens. Mast cells, which are abundant in the skin, play a significant role... Bite wounds can cause a number of signs and symptoms Jellyfish stings can trigger a complex immune response in human skin similar to the response to pathogens or allergens. When jellyfish venom, carried by the stinging cells of the animal (nematocysts), comes into contact with the skin, it interacts with various cells and substances in the body. These interactions involve keratinocytes, tissue macrophages, dendritic cells, and mast cells, which are key players in the immune system. Common allergens include pollen, certain foods, metals, insect stings, medications, and materials, such as latex. The development of allergies is due to genetic and environmental factors. The mechanism of allergic reactions involves immunoglobulin E antibodies (IgE) binding to an allergen and then to a receptor on mast cells or basophils, where they trigger the release of inflammatory chemicals such as histamine. Diagnosis is typically based on a person's medical history. Further testing of the skin or blood may be useful in certain cases. Positive tests, however, may not necessarily mean there is a significant allergy to the substance in question. == Signs and symptoms ==

Centipede bite Such a wound is not strictly speaking a bite, as the forcipules are a modified first pair of legs rather than true mouthparts. Clinically, the wound is viewed as a cutaneous condition characterized by paired hemorrhagic marks that form a chevron shape caused by the paired forcipules. The majority of bites are not life-threatening to humans and present the greatest risk to children and those who develop allergic reactions. f61e67f3a8 Common causes include allergies to insect bites and stings, allergies to foods—including nuts, peanuts, milk, fish, eggs; allergies to medications – including some antibiotics and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs); or allergies to anaesthetics or latex. Other causes can include physical exercise, and cases may also occur in some people due to escalating reactions to simple throat irritation or may also occur without an obvious reason. These symptoms typically start in minutes to hours and then increase very rapidly to life-threatening levels. Urgent medical treatment is required to prevent serious harm and death, even if the patient has used an epinephrine autoinjector or has taken other medications in response, and even if symptoms appear to be improving. f61e67f3a8 == Symptoms and signs == f61e67f3a8 The great majority of insect allergic animals just have a simple allergic response – a reaction local to the sting site which appears as just a swelling arising from the release of histamine and other chemicals from the body tissues near to the sting site. The swelling, if allergic, can be helped by the provision of an anti-histamine ointment as well as an ice pack. This is the typical response for all biting insects and many people have this common reaction. f61e67f3a8
