Cellulitis Signs and symptoms include an area of redness that increases in size over a few days. The leg is typically affected following a break in the skin from abrasions, arthropod bites, or maceration Cellulitis is usually a bacterial infection involving the inner layers of the skin. although cellulitis can occur anywhere on the body. While the redness often turns white when pressure is applied, this is not always the case. The borders of the area of redness are generally not sharp, and the skin may be swollen. Lymphatic vessels may occasionally be involved, and the person may have a fever and feel tired. The area of infection is usually painful. It specifically affects the dermis and subcutaneous fat 10d5585455

Eosinophilic cellulitis is of unknown cause. It is suspected to be an autoimmune disorder. It may be triggered by bites from insects and arachnids such as spiders, fleas, or ticks, or from medications or surgery. Diagnosis is made after other potential causes are ruled out. Skin biopsy of the affected areas may show an increased number of eosinophils. Other conditions that may appear similar include cellulitis, contact dermatitis, and severe allergic reactions such as anaphylaxis. 10d5585455

Stasis dermatitis cracks predispose patients for the entry of a bacterial infection, causing cellulitis in the leg. Stasis dermatitis is diagnosed clinically by assessing the Stasis dermatitis refers to the skin changes that occur in the leg as a result of "stasis" or blood pooling from insufficient venous return; the alternative name of varicose eczema comes from a common cause of this being varicose veins 10d5585455

Lymphangitis Other causes of Lymphangitis could be from Arthropod bites and Iatrogenic causes. Lymphangitis is sometimes mistakenly called Lymphangitis is an inflammation or an infection of the lymphatic channels that occurs as a result of infection at a site distal to the channel. The most commonly involved bacteria include Streptococcus pyogenes (Group A strep) and hemolytic streptococci. In some cases, it can be caused by viruses such as mononucleosis or cytomegalovirus, as well as specific conditions such as tuberculosis or syphilis, and the fungus Sporothrix schenckii. It may present as long red streaks spreading away from the site of infection. Lymphangitis is sometimes mistakenly called "blood poisoning". In reality, "blood poisoning" is synonymous with sepsis. fungus Sporothrix schenckii. Other causes of Lymphangitis could be from Arthropod bites and Iatrogenic causes. It is a possible medical emergency as involvement of the lymphatic system allows for an infection to spread rapidly. The most common cause of lymphangitis in humans is bacteria, in which case sepsis and death could result within hours if left untreated 10d5585455

For facial infections, a break in the skin beforehand is not usually the case. The bacteria most commonly involved are streptococci and Staphylococcus aureus. 10d5585455 Most cases are caused by Conidiobolus coronatus, a fungus found in soil and in the environment in general, which can infect healthy people. It is usually acquired by inhaling the spores of the fungus, but can be by direct infection through a cut in the skin such as an insect bite. 10d5585455 Common side effects include diarrhea, vomiting, and allergic reactions. It also increases the risk of yeast infections, headaches, and blood clotting problems. It is not recommended in people with a history of a penicillin allergy. It is relatively safe for use during pregnancy. 10d5585455 The primary treatment is supportive. Antibiotics speed healing and are recommended in those with severe disease or immune system problems. Recovery typically occurs within 4 months but can require a year. It affects approximately 1 in 10,000 people. It is more common in children. 10d5585455

Amoxicillin/clavulanic acid It is specifically used for otitis media, streptococcal pharyngitis, pneumonia, cellulitis, urinary tract infections, and animal bites. It is a combination consisting of amoxicillin, a β -lactam antibiotic, and potassium clavulanate, a β -lactamase inhibitor. It can be administered orally or intravenously Amoxicillin/clavulanic acid, also known as co-amoxiclav or amox-clav, sold under the brand names Augmentin, and Ranclav among others, is an antibiotic medication used for the treatment of a number of bacterial infections. otitis media, streptococcal pharyngitis, pneumonia, cellulitis, urinary tract infections, and animal bites. Steroids applied as a cream is generally recommended over the use of steroids by mouth. Antihistamines may be used to help with itchiness. Many times the condition goes away after a few weeks without treatment. The

condition is uncommon. It affects both sexes with the same frequency. Within the latter type, the hairs occur in structures called pilosebaceous units, each with hair follicle, sebaceous gland, and associated arrector pili muscle. In the embryo, the epidermis, hair, and glands form from the ectoderm, which is chemically influenced by the underlying mesoderm that forms the dermis and subcutaneous tissues. The two main types of human skin are: glabrous skin, the hairless skin on the palms and soles (also referred to as the "palmoplantar" surfaces), and hair-bearing skin 10d5585455
