The English version of the system is closely related to the English troy system of weights, the pound and grain being exactly the same in both. The apothecaries' system of measures is a similar system of volume units based on the fluid ounce. This exact form of the system was used in the United Kingdom; in some of its former colonies, it survived well into the 20th century. For a long time, medical recipes were written in Latin, often using special symbols to denote weights and measures. It divides a pound into 12 ounces, an ounce into 8 drachms, and a drachm into 3 scruples of 20 grains each. avoirdupois pounds and
