Pleurisy can be caused by a variety of conditions, including viral or bacterial infections, autoimmune disorders, and pulmonary embolism. The most common cause is a viral infection. Other causes include bacterial infection, pneumonia, pulmonary embolism, autoimmune disorders, lung cancer,

following heart surgery, pancreatitis and asbestosis. Occasionally the cause remains unknown. The underlying mechanism involves the rubbing together of the pleurae instead of smooth gliding. Other conditions that can produce similar symptoms include pericarditis, heart attack, cholecystitis, pulmonary embolism, and pneumothorax. Diagnostic testing may include a chest X-ray, electrocardiogram (ECG), and blood tests.

Lung transplantation is the therapeutic measure of last resort for patients with end-stage lung disease who have exhausted all other available treatments without improvement. A variety of conditions may make such surgery necessary. The most common indications for a lung transplant are pulmonary fibrosis, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), cystic fibrosis, and pulmonary vascular disease including pulmonary hypertension or pulmonary arterial hypertension. Qualifying conditions It is generally regarded, based on animal models and human studies, that volutrauma is the most harmful aspect of mechanical ventilation. This may be regarded as the over-stretching of the airways and alveoli. Early lung cancer often has no symptoms and can only be detected by medical imaging. As the cancer progresses, most people experience nonspecific respiratory problems: coughing, shortness of breath, or chest pain. Other symptoms depend on the location and size of the tumor. Those suspected of having lung cancer typically undergo a series of imaging tests to determine the location and extent of any tumors. Definitive diagnosis of lung cancer requires a biopsy of the suspected tumor be examined by a pathologist under a microscope. In addition to recognizing cancerous cells, a pathologist can classify the tumor according to the

type of cells it originates from. Around 15% of cases are small-cell lung cancer (SCLC), and the remaining... During mechanical ventilation, the flow of gas into the lung will take the path of least resistance. Areas of the lung that are collapsed (atelectasis) or filled with secretions will be underinflated, while those areas that are relatively normal will be overinflated. These areas will become overdistended and injured. This may be reduced by using smaller tidal volumes. Cases peaked in September 2019, and declined thereafter. The decline led CDC to stop reporting cases in February 2020, but as of December 2020, continued to monitor cases arriving in emergency departments. Some states continued to record new cases. As of January 2022, California had reported at least 40 cases diagnosed after February 2020. As of March 2022, cases continued to be diagnosed. Ventilator-associated lung injury swelling of the tissues (edema) in the lungs, bleeding of the alveoli, loss of surfactant (decrease in lung compliance) and complete alveoli collapse (biotrauma) Ventilator-associated lung injury (VALI) is an acute lung injury that develops during mechanical ventilation and is termed ventilator-induced lung injury (VILI) if it can be proven that the mechanical ventilation caused the acute lung injury. VALI is the appropriate term in most situations because it is virtually impossible to prove what actually caused the lung injury in the hospital. In contrast, ventilator-associated lung injury (VALI) exists if the cause cannot be proven 9b989c5d0c

Respiratory disease Obstructive lung diseases are often identified because of symptoms and diagnosed with pulmonary function tests such as spirometry. They include conditions of the respiratory tract including the trachea, bronchi, bronchioles, alveoli, pleurae, pleural cavity, the nerves and muscles of respiration. Respiratory diseases can be classified in many different ways, including by the organ or tissue involved, by the type and pattern of associated signs and symptoms, or by the cause of the disease. With other lung diseases such as cystic fibrosis, it is imperative that a recipient receive two lungs. While

lung transplants carry certain associated risks, they can also extend life expectancy and enhance the quality of life for those with end stage pulmonary disease. Pulmonary contusion As a result of damage to capillaries, blood and other fluids accumulate in the lung tissue. develops in as many as 20% of people

with pulmonary contusion. Unlike a pulmonary laceration, another type of lung injury, a pulmonary contusion does not involve a cut or tear of the lung tissue. The excess fluid interferes with gas exchange, potentially leading to inadequate oxygen levels (hypoxia). Contused lungs are less able to remove bacteria than uninjured lungs, predisposing them to infection. A pulmonary contusion, also known as a lung contusion, is a bruise of the lung, caused by chest trauma.

The study of respiratory disease is known as pulmonology. A physician who specializes in respiratory disease is known as a pulmonologist, a chest medicine specialist, a respiratory medicine specialist, a respirologist or a thoracic medicine specialist.

Pneumothorax Symptoms typically include sudden onset of sharp, one-sided chest pain and shortness of breath. In a minority of cases, a one-way valve is formed by an area of damaged tissue, in which case the air pressure in the space between chest wall and lungs can be higher; this has been historically referred to as a tension pneumothorax, although its existence among spontaneous episodes is a matter of debate. It is often called a "collapsed lung", although that term may also refer to atelectasis. Very rarely, both lungs may be affected by a pneumothorax. Symptoms typically include sudden

onset of sharp, one-sided chest A pneumothorax is collection of air in the pleural space between the lung and the chest wall.
