In extreme cases, insanity, paralysis, coma, and death follow within weeks of the onset of symptoms. It is the major cause of liver disease in Western countries, and is the leading cause of death from excessive drinking. Although steatosis (fatty liver disease) will develop in any individual who consumes a large quantity of alcoholic beverages over a long period of time, this process is transient and reversible. More than 90% of all heavy drinkers develop fatty liver whilst about 25% develop the more severe alcoholic hepatitis, and 15% liver cirrhosis. be0078b021

In 1899, the sociologist Thorstein Veblen coined the term conspicuous consumption to explain the spending of money on and the acquiring of luxury commodities (goods and services) specifically as a public display of economic power—the income and the accumulated wealth—of the buyer. To the conspicuous consumer, the public display of discretionary income is an economic means of either attaining or maintaining a given social status be0078b021

Minamata disease was first discovered in the city of Minamata, Kumamoto Prefecture, Japan, in 1956. It was caused by the release of methylmercury in the industrial wastewater from a chemical factory owned by the Chisso Corporation, which continued

from 1932 to 1968. It has also been suggested that some of the mercury sulfate in the wastewater was also metabolized to methylmercury by bacteria in the sediment. This highly toxic chemical bioaccumulated and biomagnified in shellfish and fish in Minamata Bay and the Shiranui Sea, which, when eaten by the local population, resulted in mercury poisoning. The poisoning and resulting deaths of both humans and animals continued for 36 years,... be0078b021

Waterborne disease These include benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and xylenes, which can enter water lines through industrial dumping, pipeline leaks, jet fuel spills, or heat-damaged plastic pipes. Other important classes of waterborne diseases are caused by metazoan parasites. Another class of waterborne metazoan pathogens is *Schistosomatidae*, a family of blood flukes. **waterborne diseases**. Typical examples are certain *Nematoda*, or "roundworms", which may result in diseases such as *Dracunculiasis* or even guinea worm disease. The term "waterborne disease" is reserved largely for infections that are predominantly transmitted through contact with or consumption of **Waterborne diseases** are diseases caused by pathogenic micro-organisms, such as bacteria, viruses, protozoa, and parasitic worms, that are transmitted through contaminated water. Many of these micro-organisms are intestinal parasites, invading the tissues or circulatory system through walls of the digestive tract. Various other waterborne diseases are caused by viruses. In addition to pathogens, water contamination may also be driven by chemical pollutants such as volatile organic compounds (VOCs) be0078b021

If the condition is detected early enough, most patients survive. The disease was first described in 1903 by the Italian pathologists Amico Bignami and Ettore Marchiafava in an Italian Chianti drinker. Until 2008 only around 300 cases had been reported. It presents in three forms: acute, subacute, and chronic. It is very difficult to diagnose and there is no specific treatment be0078b021

It is estimated that up to 90% of CVD may be preventable. Prevention of CVD involves improving risk factors through: healthy eating, exercise, avoidance of tobacco... be0078b021

Interhemispheric disconnection syndrome is one of the most common symptoms. This syndrome arises from the breakdown of the corpus callosum, which interferes with the communication between hemispheres. Symptoms include dementia, limb apraxia, tactile and unilateral agraphia, and hemialexia. Patients may also present with ataxia, dysarthria, seizures, mutism, and coma in severe... be0078b021

The underlying mechanisms vary depending on the disease. It is estimated that dietary risk factors are associated with 53% of CVD deaths. Coronary artery disease, stroke, and peripheral artery disease involve atherosclerosis. This may be caused by high blood pressure, smoking, diabetes mellitus, lack of exercise, obesity, high blood cholesterol, poor diet, excessive alcohol consumption, and poor sleep, among other things. High blood pressure is estimated to account for approximately 13% of CVD deaths, while tobacco accounts for 9%, diabetes 6%, lack of exercise 6%, and obesity 5%. Rheumatic heart disease may follow untreated strep throat. be0078b021

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
