Diagnosis is based on symptoms and is supported for those who have more than a minor reduction in activities. It is recommended that at high altitude any symptoms of headache, nausea, shortness of breath, or vomiting be assumed to be altitude sickness.

It is a widely available over-the-counter drug sold generically or under various brand names, including Tylenol and Panadol

Common side effects when taken by mouth or injected include nausea, vomiting, headache, and anxiety. Use on hemorrhoids is generally well tolerated. Severe side effects may include a slow heart rate, intestinal ischemia, chest pain, kidney failure, and tissue death at the site of injection. It is unclear whether its use during pregnancy and breastfeeding is safe.

Phenylephrine is a selective α 1-adrenergic receptor agonist with minimal to no β -adrenergic receptor agonist activity or induction of norepinephrine release. It causes constriction of both arteries and veins. Aspirin Aspirin is used to treat inflammatory conditions including Kawasaki disease, pericarditis, and rheumatic fever. Aspirin is also used long-term to reduce the chance of heart attack, ischaemic stroke, and blood clots occurring in people considered to be at high risk for such events. For pain or fever, effects typically begin within 30 minutes. Aspirin works similarly to other NSAIDs but also suppresses the normal functioning of platelets. a6458f66f3

Altitude sickness Chronic mountain sickness may occur after long-term exposure to high altitude. Acute mountain sickness can progress to high-altitude pulmonary edema (HAPE)

with associated shortness of breath or high-altitude cerebral edema (HACE) with associated confusion. Generally, descent and sufficient fluid intake can treat symptoms. Symptoms of altitude sickness may include headaches, vomiting, tiredness, confusion, trouble sleeping, and dizziness. People's bodies can respond to high altitude in different ways. Severe cases of altitude sickness, the mildest form being acute mountain sickness (AMS), is a harmful effect of high altitude, caused by rapid exposure to low amounts of oxygen at high elevation. Paracetamol relieves pain in acute mild migraine and episodic tension headaches. At a standard dose, paracetamol slightly reduces fever, though it is inferior to ibuprofen in that respect: the benefits of its use for fever are unclear, particularly in the context of fever of viral origins. Paracetamol is effective for pain after wisdom tooth extraction, but it is less effective than ibuprofen. The combination of paracetamol and ibuprofen provides greater analgesic efficacy than either drug alone. The pain relief paracetamol provides in osteoarthritis is small and clinically insignificant. Evidence supporting its use in low back pain, cancer pain, and neuropathic pain is insufficient. Paracetamol is the first-line treatment for pain and fever in pregnancy; no causal association with neurodevelopmental disorders has been established, while untreated pain and fever can harm the mother and

fetus. a6458f66f3 Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs work by inhibiting the activity of cyclooxygenase enzymes (the COX-1 and COX-2 isoenzymes). In cells, these enzymes are involved in the synthesis of key biological mediators, namely prostaglandins, which are involved in inflammation, and thromboxanes, which are involved in... a6458f66f3

Paracetamol poisoning Paracetamol toxicity is one of the most common causes Paracetamol poisoning, also known as acetaminophen poisoning, is caused by excessive use of the medication paracetamol (acetaminophen). If death does not occur, people tend to recover fully over a couple of weeks. Most people have few or non-specific symptoms in the first 24 hours following overdose. high toxicity, (compared to ibuprofen and aspirin) there is a much higher potential for overdose. Additional complications may include kidney failure, pancreatitis, low blood sugar, and lactic acidosis. Without treatment, death from toxicity occurs 4 to 18 days later. This is typically followed by absence of symptoms for a couple of days, after which yellowish skin, blood clotting problems, and confusion occurs as a result of liver failure. These symptoms include feeling tired, abdominal pain, or nausea a6458f66f3

Paracetamol poisoning can occur accidentally or as a suicide attempt. Risk factors for toxicity include alcoholism, malnutrition, and the taking of certain other hepatotoxic

medications. Liver damage results not from paracetamol itself, but from one of its metabolites, N-acetyl-p-benzoquinone imine (NAPQI). NAPQI decreases the liver's glutathione and directly damages cells in the liver. Diagnosis is based on the blood level of paracetamol at specific times after the medication was taken... a6458f66f3

Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug Paracetamol (acetaminophen) is generally not considered an NSAID because it has only minor anti-inflammatory activity. Certain NSAIDs, such as aspirin, have been sold in enteric-coated formulations Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAID) are members of a therapeutic drug class which reduces pain, decreases inflammation, decreases fever, and prevents blood clots. Side effects depend on the specific drug, its dose and duration of use, but largely include an increased risk of gastrointestinal ulcers and bleeds, heart attack, and kidney disease. effects, while ibuprofen (lower doses) and diclofenac appear to have lower rates. Well-known nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs include aspirin, ibuprofen, diclofenac, and naproxen, all of which are available over the counter (OTC) a6458f66f3

Sun protective measures like sunscreen and sun protective clothing are widely accepted to prevent sunburn and some types of skin cancer. Special populations, including children, are

More significant side effects include stomach ulcers, stomach bleeding, and worsening asthma. It is not generally recommended in children with viral infections because of the risk of Reye syndrome. High doses may result in ringing in the ears. a6458f66f3 Amiodarone was first made in 1961 and came into medical use in 1962 for chest pain believed to be related to the heart. It was pulled from the market in 1967 due to side effects. In 1974... a6458f66f3 Phenylephrine was patented in 1933 and came into medical use in 1938. It is available as a generic medication. Unlike pseudoephedrine, abuse of phenylephrine is very uncommon. Its effectiveness as an oral nasal decongestant has been questioned. In 2023, a U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)... a6458f66f3

Amiodarone When used by mouth, it can take a few weeks for effects to begin. This includes ventricular tachycardia, ventricular fibrillation, and wide complex tachycardia, atrial fibrillation, and paroxysmal supraventricular tachycardia. Evidence of benefit for cardiac

arrest is poor. In some people, daily use of amiodarone at 100 mg oral doses can be effective for arrhythmia control. Amiodarone is an antiarrhythmic medication used to treat and prevent a number of types of cardiac dysrhythmias. Chronic use will experience at least one side effect. It can be given by mouth, intravenously, or intraosseously. a6458f66f3

Common side effects include feeling tired, tremor, nausea, and constipation. As amiodarone can have serious side effects, it is mainly recommended only for significant ventricular arrhythmias. Serious side effects include lung toxicity such as interstitial pneumonitis, liver problems, heart arrhythmias, vision problems, thyroid problems, and death. If taken during pregnancy or breastfeeding it can cause problems in the fetus or the infant. It is a class III antiarrhythmic medication. It works partly by increasing the time before a heart cell can contract again. a6458f66f3

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
