

Dragon Fruit When In Season

Peters's dwarf epauletted fruit bat is one of the two species contained within the genus *Micropteropus*. In contrast to the other species in this genus, *Micropteropus intermedius*, both sexes contain white tufts at the proximal end of their ears. However, when adults are compared side by side, *M. pusillus* can be identified as the smaller of the two. *M. pusillus* display variance between their dorsal and ventral pelage. Fur is often described as thicker and a darker shade of brown on the dorsal surface, but the variance in color can be attributed to a lower concentration of fur along the ventral surface 7142e83f7a

The manga portion of the series debuted in Weekly Shōnen Jump on October 4, 1988, and lasted until May 23, 1995; the anime adaptation premiered in Japan on Fuji Television on April 26, 1989, taking over its predecessor's time slot, and ran until its end on January 31, 1996, lasting 291 episodes in Japan, and 276 episodes in the United States originally, although all 291 episodes were later broadcast when material from the first 67 episodes was restored 7142e83f7a

The season initially ran from April 1989 until March 1990 in Japan on Fuji Television. The season was then licensed for a heavily edited dubbed broadcast by Funimation Entertainment. Their adaptation first ran from September 1996 through September 1997 in first-run syndication, primarily on affiliate stations of Fox, The WB and UPN (United Paramount Network). The 39 episodes were cut down to a mere 28. Their edited adaptation was syndicated to television by Saban Entertainment, and was released by Geneon Entertainment (then known as Pioneer) on VHS and DVD between 1997 and 1999. Eventually, Geneon Entertainment lost the distribution license to the first 67 episodes and Funimation began redubbing the series... 7142e83f7a == Plot == 7142e83f7a The 35-episode season originally ran from March 1990 until January 1991 in Japan on Fuji Television.

The first English dub of the season (the first 10 episodes only) was produced by Filipino company Creative Products Corporation, airing on RPN 9 in the Philippines during 1996. The first North American airing of the season was in first-run syndication, primarily on affiliate stations of Fox, The WB and UPN (United Paramount Network), where it ran from September 1997 until May 1998. On August 31, 1998 the first previously syndicated and heavily edited 53 (originally 67) episodes began airing on Cartoon Network's weekday-afternoon programming block, Toonami. The English dub of this season originally featured the third Dragon Ball Z film The Tree of Might as a three-part episode (it was dubbed and aired as if it were a part of the Television series). In some males, the mantle extends across the chest, and the fur is often brighter in colour than in females. The specimens that he examined in Britain had been collected by English explorer John Whitehead, after whom the species name whiteheadi was chosen. Of Whitehead, Thomas wrote "Mr. Whitehead is to be congratulated on this interesting addition to the splendid discoveries he has already made in the Philippine Islands." The holotype was collected by Whitehead in December 1895 on the island of Mindoro at an elevation of 5,000 ft (1,500 m). Thomas created the genus Harpyionycteris for this species, and it was the only species in this genus until the description of the Sulawesi harpy fruit bat in 1921. 7142e83f7a == Description == 7142e83f7a
