

Slipped Disc Pain Medication

The majority of back pain is nonspecific and idiopathic. Common underlying mechanisms include degenerative or traumatic changes to the discs and facet joints, which can then cause secondary pain in the muscles and nerves and referred pain to the bones, joints and extremities. Diseases and inflammation of the gallbladder, pancreas, aorta and kidneys may also cause referred pain in the back. Tumors of the vertebrae, neural tissues and adjacent structures can also manifest as back pain. About 90% of sciatica is due to a spinal disc herniation pressing on one of the lumbar or sacral nerve roots. Spondylolisthesis, spinal stenosis, piriformis syndrome, pelvic tumors, and pregnancy are other possible causes of sciatica. The straight-leg-raising test is often helpful in diagnosis. The test is positive if, when the leg is raised while a person is lying on their back, pain shoots below the knee. In most cases medical imaging is not needed. However, imaging may be obtained if bowel or bladder function is affected, there is significant loss of feeling or weakness, symptoms are long standing, or there is a concern for tumor or infection. When a tear in the outer, fibrous ring of an intervertebral disc allows the soft, central portion to bulge out beyond the damaged outer rings, the disc is said to be herniated.

Lumbar spinal stenosis Lumbar spinal stenosis can cause pain in the low back or buttocks, abnormal sensations, and the absence of sensation (numbness) in the legs, thighs, feet, or buttocks, or loss of bladder and bowel control. back pain, but evidence of their efficacy is lacking. Surgery may be considered when conservative treatments—including physical therapy and medications—fail Lumbar spinal stenosis (LSS) is a medical condition in which the spinal canal narrows and compresses the nerves and blood vessels at the level of the lumbar vertebrae. Spinal stenosis may

also affect the cervical or thoracic region, in which case it is known as cervical spinal stenosis or thoracic spinal stenosis 32fe63f2af

Sciatica Typically, symptoms occur on only one side of the body; certain causes, however, may result in pain on both sides. However, evidence for effectiveness of pain medication, and of muscle relaxants, is lacking. Initial treatment typically consists of pain medications. Weakness or numbness may occur in different parts of the affected leg and foot. Lower back pain is sometimes present. This pain may extend down the back, outside, or front of the leg. The pain is often described as shooting. The onset is often sudden following activities such as heavy lifting, although it may also occur gradually. Back pain Common underlying mechanisms include degenerative or traumatic changes to the discs and facet joints Back pain (Latin: dorsalgia) is pain felt in the back. majority of back pain is nonspecific and idiopathic. It may be classified as neck pain (cervical), middle back pain (thoracic), lower back pain (lumbar) or coccydynia (tailbone or sacral pain) based on the segment affected. The pain may be characterized as a dull ache, shooting or piercing pain or a burning sensation. Discomfort can radiate to the arms and hands as well as the legs or feet, and may include numbness or weakness in the legs and arms. An episode of back pain may be acute, subacute or chronic depending on the duration. The lumbar region is the most commonly affected area 32fe63f2af

Pubic symphysis Degenerative joint disease of the symphysis, which can cause groin pain, results from instability or. treated with anti-inflammatory medication and rest 32fe63f2af

Disc herniation is frequently associated with age-related degeneration of the outer ring, known as the annulus fibrosus, but is normally triggered by trauma or straining by lifting or twisting. Tears are almost always posterolateral (on the back sides) owing to relative narrowness of the posterior longitudinal ligament relative to the anterior longitudinal ligament. A tear in the disc ring may result in the release of chemicals causing

inflammation, which can result in... 32fe63f2af The precise cause of LSS is unclear. Narrowing of spinal structures in the spinal cord such as the central canal, the lateral recesses, or the intervertebral foramen (the opening where a spinal nerve root passes) must be present, but are not sufficient to cause LSS alone. Many people who undergo MRI imaging are found to have such changes but have no symptoms. These changes are commonly seen in people who have spinal degeneration that occurs with aging (e.g., spinal disc herniation). LSS may also be caused by osteophytes, osteoporosis, a tumor, trauma, or various skeletal dysplasias, such as with pseudoachondroplasia and achondroplasia. 32fe63f2af

Disc herniation It may result in back pain, pain or abnormal sensation in different parts of the body, and physical disability. to as a slipped disc, but this term is considered inaccurate as the spinal discs are firmly attached between the vertebrae and cannot "slip" out of place A disc herniation, also known as a spinal disc herniation, is a condition affecting the intervertebral disc between two vertebrae, usually caused by excessive strain or trauma to the spine. The risk of disc herniation may be reduced by maintaining core strength and an awareness of body mechanics including good posture. The most conclusive diagnostic tool for disc herniation is MRI, and treatments may range from painkillers to surgery 32fe63f2af

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
