In the 18th century, jigsaw puzzles were created by painting a picture on a flat, rectangular piece of wood, then cutting it into small pieces. The name "jigsaw" derives from the tools used to cut the images into pieces—variably identified as jigsaws, fretsaws or scroll saws. John Spilsbury, a London cartographer and engraver, is credited with commercialising jigsaw puzzles around 1760. His design took world maps, and cut out the individual nations in order for them to be reassembled by students as a geographical teaching aid. With this in mind, they are often used as an intelligence test or in problem solving training.

While puzzles of this type have been in use by humanity as early as the 3rd century BC, one of the most well-known mechanical puzzles of modern day is the Rubik's Cube, invented by the Hungarian architect Ernő Rubik in 1974. The puzzles are typically designed for a single player, where the goal is for the player to discover the principle of the object, rather than accidentally coming up with the right solution through trial and error ec35cf0f3d

In 1867, in the French chess journal *Le Sphinx*, an intellectual precursor to the nine dots puzzle

appeared credited to Sam Loyd. Loyd's puzzle asked for a sequence of 14 moves of a chess queen passing through all the squares of a chessboard and returning to the starting square; this can be considered as a "64 dots puzzle" of covering all dots of an 8-by-8 square lattice with a closed polygonal path whose segments are horizontal, vertical, or diagonal, and that turns only at the dots. Crosswords commonly appear in newspapers and magazines.

The earliest crosswords that resemble their modern form were popularized by the New York World in the 1910s. Many variants of crosswords are popular around the world, including cryptic crosswords and many language-specific variants.
