As of 2023, the International Cat Association (TICA) recognizes 75 standardized breeds, the Cat Fanciers' Association (CFA) recognizes 45, the Fédération Internationale Féline (FIFe) recognizes 50, the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF) recognizes 45, and the World Cat Federation (WCF) recognizes 69. Governing Council of the Cat Fancy The GCCF registers around 20,000 pedigree cats each The Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF) is the oldest cat registry, established in 1910 and the largest organisation that registers pedigree cats in the United Kingdom. popular cat breeds registered in the GCCF are the British Shorthair, the Ragdoll and the Maine Coon. It is one of the nine members of the World Cat Congress, making it one of the major and reputable cat registries for pedigree registration of cat breeds worldwide

The Oriental Longhair breed differs only with respect to coat length. Oriental Shorthair, breed of cat combining the Siamese body with a diversity of colorings and patterns

Oriental bicolour Although there was An Oriental bicolour is any cat of Oriental type, either long-haired or short-haired and in any pattern including colourpoint, which has white areas on its coat caused by the white spotting gene. In most cat fancier and breeder organisations, Oriental bicolours do not constitute a standardised breed, but a coat pattern variant of the breed of their foundation stock. recognition in 2003 to the bicoloured Oriental Shorthairs and in 2005 to the colourpoint and white cats under the breed name Seychellois. One breed registry is an exception, the UK-based Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF), which has defined them as a separate breed named Oriental Bicolour (capitalised)

The gene that causes the... ACFA is directly affiliated with the Cat Aficionado Association of China, who use the ACFA breed standards. Starting in 1979, Grillo carried out a series of matings between Siamese and bicoloured American Shorthair. She then selected the best bicoloured offspring to mate back to Siamese or Orientals in order to regain type. The variety was granted recognition by TICA in 1983 and the first champion was Ciara Quite-N-Oreo. ACFA recognizes 70 breeds for championship competition. ACFA sanctioned cat shows include classes for registered kittens ages 4-8 months, for cats from an experimental breed or a new color, championship unaltered adult cats, championship altered cats, and a household pet class for mixed-breed or pedigreed cats who don't meet the breed standard. The breed was one of the most popular cat breeds in Europe and North America in the 19th century. Around the 1950s, the modern-style body with slender and angular features became the preferred type by Siamese enthusiasts. From the 1980s onwards, the traditional "old-style" (rounder-built) cats started to officially split off from the (modern-style) Siamese breed and were re-established by multiple registries as the separate Thai cat breed. The terms "Siamese" or "Thai" are used for... Depending on the cat registry in question, the Javanese may be treated as a stand-alone breed, considered a Javanese division of the Balinese, or subsumed with the Himalayan into a merged breed called simply Colourpoint. In others, the cats considered non-traditional colored Balinese cats by the CFA, are also accepted as Balinese cats. == History... == 3ff9981b4d == History == 3ff9981b4d Inconsistency in a breed's classification and naming among registries means that an individual animal may be considered different breeds by different registries (though not necessarily eligible for registry in them all, depending on its exact ancestry). For example, TICA's Himalayan is considered a colorpoint variety of the Persian by the CFA, while the Javanese, (or Colorpoint Longhair) is a color variation of the Balinese in both the TICA and the CFA; both breeds are merged (along with the Colorpoint Shorthair) into a single "mega-breed", the... 3ff9981b4d Bengal cats originate from hybridisation of leopard cats and domestic cats. Most Bengal cats used in Serengeti breeding programs are many generations removed from these origins and possess few genetic contributions of the wild forebears except alleles affecting coat colour. From the Bengal × Oriental cross came the first foundation Serengeti. Breeders then worked with the cat to produce a cat that resembles the breed profile set by the cat registries. 3ff9981b4d

Oriental Shorthair It maintains the modern Siamese head and body type but appears in a wide range of coat colours and patterns. Like the Siamese, Orientals have almond-shaped eyes, a triangular head shape, large ears, and an elongated, slender, and muscular body. The Oriental Shorthair is a breed of domestic cat that is developed from and closely related to the Siamese cat. Unlike the breed's blue-eyed Siamese forebear, Orientals are usually green-eyed. In some registries, including the CFA, the Oriental Shorthair and Oriental Longhair are a single breed, the Oriental, with two divisions Domestic cats have been diversified by humans into breeds and domestic and wild hybrids. == Description == 3ff9981b4d In 1977 the Oriental Shorthair was accepted by the Cat Fanciers' Association (CFA) for championship competition. Since 1997, it has also received recognition from the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF) and various other cat breeding organisations. The breed is among the most popular among CFA members. 3ff9981b4d The Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF) traces its origins to the earliest days of the modern cat fancy, with its register dating back to the establishment of the National Cat Club in 1887; the first ever cat registry originating in England. Initially, the National Cat Club also served as the governing body for the cat fancy until 1910. In 1898, a rival registry, the Cat Club, was founded by Lady Marcus Beresford, but dissolved in 1903, giving way to the [British] Cat Fanciers' Association. During this period, cats could only be registered with one of the two competing registries. 3ff9981b4d
