nuts (pistachio, almond, walnut, coconut and Brazil nuts 3-Nitropropionic acid (3-NPA) is a mycotoxin which is severely toxic to humans. There is no known antidote to 3-nitropropionic acid poisoning. It is a potent suicidal inhibitor of succinate dehydrogenase, an enzyme in the citric acid cycle and mitochondrial energy chain. Mild cases of exposure give rise to nausea, vomiting, and stomach ache, while severe cases lead to brain damage or death 7559f1cf38

Chili peppers originated in Central or South America and were first cultivated in Mexico. European explorers brought chili peppers back to the Old World in the late 15th century as part of the Columbian exchange, which led to the cultivation of multiple varieties across the world for food and traditional medicine. 3-nitropropionic acid is produced by a number of fungi, most notably in the *Aspergillus* family, and may be found in food such as in sugar cane as well as Japanese fungally fermented staples, including miso, soy sauce, katsuobushi, coconuts and some traditional Chinese medicines. Several outbreaks of 3-nitropropionic acid poisoning have been linked to

contamination of shared food crops, particularly in China, where sugar cane is commonly consumed by children.

The expression has been increasingly used by Indian organisations aligning with Hindutva, a Hindu nationalist ideology, such as the Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP), Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and their allies, which adopted the slogan in the late 20th century as a tool for increasing the visibility of Hinduism in public spaces, before going on to use it as a battle cry. Hair coloring known are henna (*Lawsonia inermis*), indigo dye, *Cassia obovata*, senna, turmeric, and amla. The main reasons for this are cosmetic: to cover gray or white hair, to alter hair to create a specific look, to change a color to suit preference or to restore the original hair color after it has been discolored by hairdressing processes or sun bleaching. In biochemistry, it involves adding a class-specific (DNA, proteins, lipids, carbohydrates) dye to a substrate to qualify or quantify the presence of a specific compound. Staining and fluorescent tagging can serve similar purposes. Biological staining is also used to mark cells in flow cytometry, and to flag proteins or nucleic acids in gel electrophoresis. Anhydrous and all hydrated forms are colorless or white. The two rarer hydrates are dihydrate $\text{CaC}_2\text{O}_4 \cdot 2\text{H}_2\text{O}$, which occurs naturally as the mineral weddellite, and trihydrate $\text{CaC}_2\text{O}_4 \cdot 3\text{H}_2\text{O}$, which occurs naturally as the mineral caoxite, are also recognized. The monohydrate $\text{CaC}_2\text{O}_4 \cdot \text{H}_2\text{O}$ occurs naturally as the mineral whewellite, forming envelope-shaped crystals, known in plants as raphides. Calcium oxalate is also found in beerstone, a scale that forms on containers used in breweries. Cultural groups with diets that depend highly on fruits and vegetables high in calcium oxalate, such as those in Micronesia, reduce the level of it by boiling and cooking them. It forms hydrates $\text{CaC}_2\text{O}_4 \cdot n\text{H}_2\text{O}$, where n varies from 1 to 3. They are a constituent in 76% of human kidney stones 7559f1cf38

Mortars and pestles have been used in cooking since the Stone Age; today they are typically associated with the pharmacy profession due to their historical use in preparing medicines. They are used in chemistry settings for pulverizing small amounts of chemicals; in arts and cosmetics for pulverizing pigments, binders, and other substances; in ceramics for making grog; in masonry and other types of construction requiring pulverized materials. In cooking, they are typically used to crush spices, to make pesto, and certain cocktails such
