Attacks are more likely to happen when changes occur in a person's daily routine. These triggers can include lack of sleep, disrupted sleep, skipped meals, and hormonal fluctuations.

A periorbital hematoma, commonly called a black eye or a shiner (associated with boxing or stick sports such as hockey), is bruising around the eye commonly due to an injury to the face rather than to the eye. This leads to formation of hematoma a few hours after the head injury or cranial operation. sometimes worsen and may require professional medical treatment before it will resolve. This is more likely if the area around both eyes has been injured (raccoon eyes) or if there is a history of prior head injury or fracture around the eye. Pain appears out of nowhere. Symptoms are usually limited to one side of the head. In most cases, the individual affected will experience intense, sharp pain and paralysis of muscles around the eye. Symptoms may subside without medical intervention, yet recur without a noticeable pattern. Patients with this disorder describe it as almost like being stabbed in the head. The pain also comes from behind the eyes, forehead, and around the temple area. Not only is the disorder painful, but it is also severe.

Migraine is believed to result from a combination of genetic, environmental, and neurological factors that affect the activity of nerve cells and chemical signals in the brain. Migraine attacks are theorized to occur when the brain exceeds an individual's sensitivity threshold.

In addition, affected individuals may experience paralysis of various facial nerves and drooping of the upper eyelid (ptosis). Other signs include double vision, fever, chronic fatigue, vertigo or arthralgia. Occasionally, the patient may present with a feeling of protrusion of one or both eyeballs (exophthalmos). Patients may lose their sight, and experience nausea and vomiting.

The lateral sulcus divides both the frontal lobe and parietal lobe above from the temporal lobe below. It is in both hemispheres of the brain. The lateral sulcus is one of the earliest-developing sulci of the human brain, appearing around the fourteenth week of gestational age.

== Etymology ==

The cause is unknown. The underlying mechanism involves inflammation of the small blood vessels that supply the walls of larger arteries. This mainly affects arteries around the head and neck, though some in the chest may also be affected. Diagnosis is suspected based on symptoms, blood tests, and medical imaging, and confirmed by biopsy of the temporal artery. However, in about 10% of people the temporal artery is normal.

The word "sinusitis" is used to indicate that one or more of the membrane linings found in the sinus cavities has become inflamed or infected. It is however distinct from a fistula, which is a tract connecting two epithelial surfaces. If left untreated, infections occurring in the sinus cavities can affect the chest and lungs.
