Domestication is a gradual process, so there is no precise moment in the history of a given species when it can be considered to have become fully domesticated. Many factors determine how quickly any changes may occur in a species, but there is not always a desire to improve a species from its wild form. In order to be considered fully domesticated, most species have undergone significant genetic, behavioural and morphological changes from their wild ancestors, while others have changed very little from their wild ancestors despite hundreds or thousands of years of potential selective breeding. Emotion in animals Cognitive bias tests and learned helplessness models have shown feelings of optimism and pessimism in a wide range of species, including rats, dogs, cats, rhesus macaques, sheep, chicks, starlings, pigs, and honeybees. Charles Darwin was one of the first scientists to write about the subject, and his observational (and sometimes anecdotal) approach has since developed into a more robust, hypothesis-driven, scientific approach. and animals suggests that it is philosophically legitimate to ascribe emotions to animals. Mentioning seven core emotional feelings reflected through a variety of neuro-dynamic limbic emotional action systems, including seeking, fear, rage, lust, care, panic and play. Through brain stimulation and pharmacological challenges, such emotional responses can be effectively monitored. Jaak Panksepp played a large role in the study of animal emotion, basing his research on the neurological aspect. The existence and nature of emotions in non-human animals are believed to be correlated with those of humans and to have evolved from the same mechanisms.
