== Signs and symptoms == 607a6a1923 Kernohan's notch phenomenon is a result of the compression of the cerebral peduncle, which is part of the mesencephalon, against the tentorium cerebelli due to transtentorial herniation. This produces ipsilateral hemiparesis or hemiplegia. 607a6a1923 The cause of most brain tumors is unknown, though up to 4% of brain cancers may be caused by CT scan radiation. Uncommon risk factors include exposure to vinyl chloride, Epstein-Barr virus, ionizing radiation, and inherited syndromes such as neurofibromatosis, tuberous sclerosis, and von Hippel-Lindau Disease. With DNTs often causing epileptic seizures, surgical removal is a common treatment, providing high rates of success. 607a6a1923 A highly malignant undifferentiated primitive neuroepithelial tumour of children, medulloepithelioma may contain bone, cartilage, skeletal muscle, and tends to metastasize extracranially. 607a6a1923 The skull is an incompressible closed space with a limited volume (Monro-Kellie Doctrine). When there is increased cranial pressure in the brain, a shift in the brain forms towards the only opening of the skull, the foramen magnum. Thus, when an increase of pressure in a hemisphere... 607a6a1923 Due to rapid growth of the tumour, patients typically present with increased intracranial pressure, seizures, and focal neurologic signs. 607a6a1923 Herniation can also occur in the absence of high ICP when mass lesions such as hematomas occur at the borders of brain compartments. In such cases local pressure is increased at the place where the herniation occurs, but this pressure is not transmitted to the rest of the brain, and therefore does not register as an increase in ICP. 607a6a1923

== Signs and symptoms == 607a6a1923 The Brain Tumour Charity was created in 2013 through the merger of Brain Tumour UK, the Samantha Dickson Brain Tumour Trust, and the Joseph Foote Trust. The Samantha Dickson Brain Tumour Trust was founded in 1996 by Neil and Angela Dickson, whose daughter Samantha died of a brain tumour when she was 16 years old. Andy Foote founded The Joseph Foote Fund in 2007 after his son, Joseph, died of a brain tumour. The Foote family began raising funds for research into the causes and treatment of brain tumours. In 1997, the UK Brain Tumour Society was founded, later becoming Brain Tumour UK. 607a6a1923

Kernohan's notch Fujimoto, A; Sato H; Katayama W; Nakai K; Kernohan's notch is a cerebral peduncle indentation associated with some forms of transtentorial herniation (uncal herniation). Kernohan's notch is an ipsilateral condition, in that a left-sided primary lesion (in which Kernohan's notch would be on the right side) evokes motor impairment in the left side of the body and a right-sided primary injury evokes motor impairment in the right side of the body. 490. doi:10. 27 (4): 490–508. It is a secondary condition caused by a primary injury on the opposite hemisphere of the brain. The seriousness of Kernohan's notch varies depending on the primary problem causing it, which may range from benign brain tumors to advanced subdural hematoma. 1093/brain/27. (1904) 607a6a1923

The cerebrum, the largest part of the human brain, consists of two cerebral hemispheres. Each hemisphere has an inner core composed of white matter, and an outer surface – the cerebral cortex – composed of grey matter. The cortex has an outer layer, the neocortex, and an inner allocortex. The neocortex is made up of six neuronal layers, while the allocortex has three or four. Each hemisphere is divided into four lobes – the frontal, parietal, temporal, and occipital lobes. The frontal lobe is associated with executive functions including self-control, planning, reasoning, and abstract thought, while the occipital lobe is dedicated to vision. Within each lobe, cortical areas are associated with specific functions, such as the sensory, motor, and association... 607a6a1923 In addition, brain injuries can be classified by timing: primary injuries occur at the moment of trauma, while secondary injuries develop afterward due to physiological responses. They can also be categorized by location: focal injuries affect specific areas, whereas diffuse injuries involve widespread brain regions. 607a6a1923 Brain Tumor Awareness Month began in March 2004, predominantly in the United Kingdom, and was founded by a group of brain tumor charities. The United States first observed Brain Tumor Awareness Month in May 2008. 607a6a1923 It is an accepted medical sign of a midbrain lesion, first described in 1927 by J Collier. With the eyes in the primary position, the sclera can be seen above the cornea, and further upgaze increases the distance between the eyelids and irises. Causes include upper dorsal midbrain supranuclear lesions such as Parinaud's syndrome, 'top of the basilar syndrome', midbrain infarction, neurodegeneration or tumour, multiple sclerosis, encephalitis, and Miller-Fisher syndrome. The cause is thought to be damage to the posterior commissure levator inhibitory fibres which originate in the M-group of neurons. 607a6a1923

== Mechanism == 607a6a1923 Seizures and epilepsy are the strongest ties to dysembryoplastic neuroepithelial tumours. The most common symptom of DNTs are complex partial seizures. Simple DNTs more frequently manifest generalized seizures. In children, DNTs are considered to be the second leading cause of epilepsy. A headache is another common symptom. Diplopia may also be a result of a DNT. Other neurological impairments besides seizures are not common. 607a6a1923 Because herniation puts extreme pressure on parts of the brain and thereby cuts off the blood supply to various parts of the brain, it is often fatal.
