Heligmosomoides polygyrus Eggs are shed Heligmosomoides polygyrus is a naturally occurring intestinal roundworm of rodents. The parasite has a direct lifecycle, with its larval form being the infective stage. Infected mice pass faeces containing eggs, and egg sizes vary between 70 and 84 micrometres (µm) in length and 37 and 53 µm in width. This nematode is widely used as a gastrointestinal parasitic model in immunological, pharmacological, and toxicological studies. H. It belongs to the family Trychostrongylidae, and male and female worms are morphologically distinguishable. polygyrus has the ability to establish chronic infections in rodents and alter host immune responses 6a84c72855

Normally, human feces are semisolid, with a mucus coating. Small pieces of harder, less moist feces can sometimes be seen impacted in the distal (final or lower) end. It grows to a diameter of about 70 mm (2.8 in). The inner surface is glossy white or bluish-white and often has a narrow black rim. 6a84c72855

Chaetopterus They are planktonic in their juvenile forms, as is typical for polychaete annelids. Parchment tube worms are filter feeders and spend their adult lives in their tubes, unless the tube is damaged or destroyed. hypothesised that this nudibranch feeds on the mucus net which Chaetopterus uses to trap its food or on the faeces of Chaetopterus. The common name arises from the parchment-like appearance of the tubes that house these worms. Tenellia rolleri is another Chaetopterus or the parchment worm or parchment tube worm is a genus of marine polychaete worm that lives in a tube it constructs in sediments or attaches to a rocky or coral reef substrate. Species include the recently discovered deep water Chaetopterus pugaporcinus and the well-studied Chaetopterus variopedatus 6a84c72855

The term "crayfish" is applied to saltwater species in some countries. 6a84c72855 == Description == 6a84c72855 Zenopontonia rex is a robust shrimp growing to a length of about 3 cm (1.2 in), with females being rather larger and slightly less colourful. The antennae are modified into a series of plates that extend forwards from the head, and the rostrum has a crest-like extension. The cephalothorax bears a small spine on either side. The first two pairs of legs bear pincers with short sensory hairs. The basic colour of this shrimp is orange-yellow to orange-red, with purple antennal plates, claws and walking legs. However, during the day, white chromatophores in the skin expand and may cover much of the dorsal surface and tail fan; in other instances, the white colour appears as a median band, and the basic orange colour is revealed elsewhere. Crayfish Some species are found in brooks and streams, where fresh water is running, while others thrive in swamps, ditches, and paddy fields. Most crayfish cannot tolerate polluted water, although some species, such as Procambarus clarkii, are hardier. Taxonomically, they are members of the superfamilies Astacoidea and Parastacoidea. Crayfish feed on animals and plants, either living or decomposing, and detritus. Such an investment in the wrapping of the microbial free faeces in a protein rich Crayfish, crawfish, or crawdads are freshwater crustaceans belonging to the infraorder Astacidea, which also contains lobsters. hindgut are wrapped in a peritrophic membrane, so they look like a tube. The tubes the worms live in are either attached to rocks, or, more commonly, buried in sandy bottoms in shallow waters. The worm has spines along its body segments that are modified for tunneling into the sandy substrate to create the u-shaped tube within which it lives. The tubes are upright u-shaped tunnels lined with mucous, then the parchment tube, with the worm living inside the parchment tube. Each parchment tube ends with a chimney of parchment that juts above the substrate. The tubes can be as long

Saliva contains amylase, and lingual lipase, secreted by the salivary glands, and serous glands on the tongue. Chewing mixes the food with saliva to produce a food bolus to be swallowed down the esophagus to enter the stomach. The second stage, the gastric phase, takes place in the stomach, where the food is further broken down by mixing with gastric juice until it passes into the duodenum, the first part of the small intestine.
