In the times of Ancient

Hawai'i, Kona was the name of the leeward district on each major island. In Hawai'i, the Pacific anticyclone provides moist prevailing northeasterly winds to the Hawaiian islands, resulting in rain when the winds contact the windward landmass of the islands - the winds subsequently lose their moisture and travel on to the leeward (or kona) side of the island. When this pattern reverses, it can produce a Kona storm from the west. Kona has cognates with the same meaning in other Polynesian languages.

Hawaii consists of 137 volcanic islands that make up almost the entire Hawaiian archipelago (the exception is Midway Atoll). Hawaiian settlement on the 'Ewa Plain dates back at least to the 12th century C.E., at which time kanaka maoli expanded the main channel of Pu'uloa (Pearl Harbor) before creating fishponds and terraced agricultural fields in the surrounding area.
