== Notable presidents == The British Association of Dermatologists, which was the largest single donor in 2009, works closely with the British Skin Foundation. He joined the Edinburgh Royal Infirmary's skin department in 1923, rising to become consultant-in-charge (physician) in 1936. From 1946 he was the Grant Professor of Dermatology at the University of Edinburgh. He was born in Kirkcaldy in Fife, the son of E J Percival. The charity also has a HealthUnlocked online community providing peer support and help to people with skin disease and skin cancer. Griffiths graduated with a first-class degree in Anatomy from St Thomas's Hospital Medical School in 1976 and completed an MBBS in Medicine in 1979. He trained in Dermatology at St Mary's Hospital, London, where he was a Wellcome Trust Clinical Research Training Fellow from 1985 to 1987. In 1987 he became a research fellow in Dermatology at the University of Michigan, becoming an Assistant Professor from 1989 to 1993. He founded the Manchester Dermatopharmacology Unit and the Manchester Psoriasis Service in 1994, and co-founded the International Psoriasis Council in 2004. Wilkinson's mother, Muriel, a concert... 01c9334df3 Wilkinson made some of the earliest dermatological descriptions of skin diseases including perioral dermatitis, photocontact dermatitis and Sneddon-Wilkinson disease. Described as "one of the greatest dermatologists of our time", he became president of the British Association of Dermatologists in 1979 and won the Sir Archibald Grey medal in 1984. 01c9334df3 == Dermatologists in popular culture == 01c9334df3 He became an eminent dermatologist, a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh, and president of the British Association of Dermatologists in 1961–62. In 1928 he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh. His proposers were George Barger, David Murray Lyon, Arthur Logan Turner and James Lorrain Smith.
