Naranathu was one of Vararuchi's 12 children and was brought up in the Naranathu Mangalathu Mana, situated at Chethallur in Palakkad district. Vararuchi's children were also known as Parayi Petta Panthirukulam (twelve children born from the Pariah woman). Naranthu came to Thiruvegappura to master 'Vedas'. Thiruvegappura and the nearby Rayiranelloor Mountain, known as 'Branthachalam', became his usual abode. Due to his strange behaviour and odd activities, people perceived him as 'mad'. At Rayiranellor Mountain, he had the vision of the Devi (Goddess), and later, for the people's benevolence, he enshrined Devi in the Mountain and started his worship there.
