

Historia De La Microbiologia

The virus was first confirmed to have spread to Spain on 31 January 2020, when a German tourist tested positive for SARS-CoV-2 in La Gomera, Canary Islands. Post-hoc genetic analysis has shown that at least 15 strains of the virus had been imported, and community transmission began by mid-February. By 13 March, cases had been confirmed in all 50 provinces of the country.

== Early life ==

The first studies on the native languages of Venezuela and the indigenous customs were made in the middle of the XVIII century by the Catholic missionaries. On 25 February, four new cases related to the Italian cluster were confirmed in Spain: US and Canada Fellows Mochales studied biology at the Complutense University of Madrid and specialized in biochemistry, clinical microbiology, and molecular biology. Initially not considering including her name among the participating scientists in the patent, her American research colleague from Merck Research, David Heindlin, insisted, resulting in her name appearing in both the application and the patent granted in 1972. She is known due to her involvement in the discovery and patenting of Fosfomycin.
