A key feature of wound healing is stepwise repair of lost extracellular matrix (ECM), the

largest component of the dermal skin layer. However, in some cases, physiological insult or disorder - in this case, diabetes mellitus - impedes the wound healing process. In diabetic wounds, the inflammatory phase of the healing process is prolonged, delaying the formation of mature granulation tissue and reducing the healing wound's tensile strength. 0212e84fea

Corn (pathology) The visible portion of the corn tends to be more or less round, but corns are defined by having a hard tapering root that is directed inward, and pressure on the corn pushes this root deeper into the flesh (thus the Latin term *clavus* meaning "nail"). smooth) skin surfaces, especially on the dorsal surface of toes or fingers, but corns triggered by an acute injury (such as a thorn) may occur on the thicker skin. A corn or *clavus* (plural *clavi* or *clavuses*) is an often painful, cone-shaped, inwardly directed callus of dead skin that forms at a pressure point near a bone, or on a weight-bearing part of the body. Pressure corns usually occur on thin or glabrous (hairless and smooth) skin surfaces, especially on the dorsal surface of toes or fingers, but corns triggered by an acute injury (such as a thorn) may occur on the thicker skin of the palms (palmar corns) or bottom of the feet (plantar corns). When on the feet, corns can be so painful as to interfere with walking. 0212e84fea

Diabetic foot ulcer It is thought to occur due to abnormal pressure or mechanical stress chronically applied to the foot, usually with concomitant predisposing conditions such as peripheral sensory neuropathy, peripheral motor neuropathy, autonomic neuropathy or peripheral arterial disease. The growth factors play an important role in wound healing and angiogenesis. Poor wound healing in diabetes mellitus may be related to perlecan expression. Diabetic foot ulcer is a breakdown of the skin and sometimes deeper tissues of the foot that leads to sore formation. It is a major complication of diabetes mellitus, and it is a type of diabetic foot disease. Secondary complications to the ulcer, such as infection of the skin or subcutaneous tissue, bone infection, gangrene or sepsis are possible, often leading to amputation. 0212e84fea

Leprosy is spread between people, although extensive contact is necessary. Leprosy has a low pathogenicity, and 95% of people who contract or who are exposed to *M. leprae* do not develop the disease. Spread is likely through a cough or contact with fluid from the nose of a person infected by leprosy. Genetic factors and baseline immune function play a role in how easily a

person catches the disease. Leprosy is not spread during pregnancy to the unborn child or through sexual genital contact. There are two main types of the disease—paucibacillary and multibacillary, which differ in the number of bacteria present. The condition is caused by a microbial

inflammation of the paronychium causing a granuloma within which the nail is buried. A true ingrown toenail is caused by actual penetration of flesh by a sliver of toenail. 0212e84fea

Dermatophyte Species capable of reproducing sexually belong in the teleomorphic genus *Arthroderma*, of the Ascomycota (see Teleomorph, anamorph and holomorph for more information on this type of fungal life cycle). As of 2019 a total of nine genera are identified and new phylogenetic taxonomy has been proposed. There are about 40 species in these three genera. Leprosy symptoms may begin within one year or take 20 years or more. Infection can lead to damage of the nerves, respiratory tract, skin, and eyes. Injuries can become infected, causing tissue damage and shortening of fingers, toes, and limbs Leprosy, also known as Hansen's disease (HD), is a long-term infection by the bacterium *Mycobacterium leprae* or *Mycobacterium lepromatosis* 0212e84fea

Pressure corns form when chronic pressure on the skin against an underlying bone traces a usually elliptical path during the rubbing motion. The corn forms at the center of the pressure point and gradually widens and deepens. 0212e84fea

Dermatophytes cause infections of the skin, hair, and nails, obtaining nutrients from keratinized material. The organisms colonize the keratin tissues causing inflammation as the host responds to metabolic byproducts. Colonies of dermatophytes are usually restricted to the nonliving cornified layer of the epidermis because of their inability to penetrate the viable tissue of an immunocompetent host. He had a research laboratory and a medical practice in Pine Hill, New Jersey.
