Systolic pressure is peak pressure in the arteries, which occurs near the end of the cardiac cycle when the ventricles are contracting. Diastolic pressure is minimum pressure in the arteries, which occurs near the beginning of the cardiac cycle when the ventricles are filled with blood. An example of normal measured values for a resting, healthy adult human is 120 mmHg systolic and 80 mmHg diastolic (written as 120/80 mmHg, and spoken as "one-twenty over eighty"). The difference between the systolic and diastolic pressures is referred to as pulse pressure (not to be confused with pulse rate/heart rate) and has clinical significance in a wide variety of situations. PAP systems use a device connected to a facial or nasal interface to generate positive-pressure airflow. The principal forms of PAP therapy are continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP), which maintains a constant pressure level; bilevel positive airway pressure (BiPAP or BPAP), which provides different pressures during inhalation and exhalation; and automatic positive airway pressure (APAP), which automatically adjusts pressure in response to breathing patterns.
