People are classified as obese when their body mass index (BMI)—a person's weight divided by the square of the person's height—is over 30 kg/m²; the range 25–30 kg/m² is defined as overweight. Obesity is a major cause of disability and is correlated with various diseases and conditions, particularly cardiovascular diseases, type 2 diabetes, obstructive sleep apnea, certain types of cancer, and osteoarthritis

Social stigma of obesity Stigmatization of obesity is usually associated with increased health risks (morbidity) of being overweight or obese and the possibility of a shorter lifespan (mortality). Such social stigmas

Bariatric surgery Long-term weight loss with bariatric surgery may be achieved through alteration of gut hormones, physical reduction of stomach size, reduction of nutrient absorption, or a combination of these. Standard of care procedures include Roux en-Y bypass, sleeve gastrectomy, and biliopancreatic diversion with duodenal switch, from which weight loss is largely achieved by altering gut hormone levels responsible for hunger and satiety, leading to a new hormonal weight set point. metabolic surgery or weight loss surgery) is a group of surgical procedures used to manage obesity and related conditions. Persons with PMOS are not more likely than those without to have true ovarian cysts. A blood test for high levels of anti-Müllerian hormone can replace the ultrasound in the diagnosis. Other symptoms associated with PMOS are heavy periods, acne, difficulty getting pregnant, and patches of darker skin. 18a3ba3bcd In morbidly obese people, bariatric surgery is the most effective treatment for weight loss and reducing complications. A 2021 meta-analysis found that bariatric surgery was associated with reduction in all-cause mortality among obese adults with or without type 2 diabetes. This meta-analysis also found that median life-expectancy was 9.3 years longer for obese adults with diabetes who received bariatric surgery as compared to routine (non-surgical) care, whereas the life expectancy gain was 5.1 years for obese adults without diabetes. Polyendocrine metabolic ovarian syndrome A healthy lifestyle and weight control are recommended for general management. Polyendocrine metabolic ovarian syndrome (PMOS), previously called polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), is the most common hormonal disorder in women of reproductive age. Management focuses on relieving symptoms and reducing long-term risks 18a3ba3bcd

The exact cause of PMOS remains uncertain. There is a clear genetic component, but environmental factors are also thought to contribute. PMOS occurs in between 5% and 18% of women. The disorder is linked to insulin resistance, which is made worse by obesity. Insulin resistance and related excess insulin levels increase the risk of complications such as type 2 diabetes and liver disease. Those living with PMOS also have higher risk of endometrial cancer. 18a3ba3bcd Individuals with anorexia nervosa have a fear of gaining weight, despite the fact that they are typically underweight. The DSM-5 describes this perceptual symptom as "disturbance in the way in which one's body weight or shape is experienced". Recent research has shown that this disturbance is based not on visual body-size overestimation but rather on body dissatisfaction: individuals with anorexia can accurately visually identify their body size, but find severely underweight bodies the most attractive. Individuals with anorexia nervosa may also deny that their symptoms or behaviors are indicative of illness. They may weigh themselves frequently, eat small amounts, and only eat certain foods in order to be in as much control of their body appearance as possible. Some patients with anorexia nervosa binge eat and purge to further influence their weight or shape. Childhood obesity Roux-en-Y Childhood obesity is a condition where excess body fat negatively affects a child's health or well-being. As methods to determine body fat directly are difficult, the diagnosis of obesity is often based on BMI. The term overweight rather than obese is often used when discussing childhood obesity, as it is less stigmatizing, although the term overweight can also refer to a different BMI category.
