By the Autumn, COVID-19 cases were again rising. This led to the creation of new regulations along with the introduction of the concept of a local lockdown, a variance in restrictions in a more specific geographic location than the four nations of the UK. Lockdowns took place in Wales, England and Northern Ireland later that season. Moderna COVID-19 vaccine Depending on the jurisdiction, it is authorized for use in humans aged six months, twelve years, or eighteen years and older. The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine provides protection against COVID-19, which is caused by infection by the SARS-CoV-2 virus. A different version of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, sold under the brand name Mnexspike (mRNA-1283), was approved for medical use in the United States in May 2025, and in the European Union in February 2026. (Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine, Bivalent) containing elasomeron/elasomeron 0-omicron (Spikevax Bivalent Zero/Omicron) were authorized for use as booster doses The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, sold under the brand name Spikevax among others, is a COVID-19 vaccine developed by the American company Moderna, the United States National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), and the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA) c1f8f94b5a

Spikevax is designed to be administered in two or three 0.5-mL doses given by intramuscular injection, primarily into the deltoid muscle, at an interval of at least 28 days apart. The World Health Organization advises an eight-week interval between doses to optimize efficacy. Additional

booster doses are approved in some regions to maintain immunity. Clinical trials and real-world data have demonstrated the vaccine's high efficacy, with significant... c1f8f94b5a

In an endemic phase, people continue to become infected and ill, but in relatively stable numbers. Precisely what would constitute an endemic phase is contested. Unlike a pandemic, an endemic disease occurs at predictable and manageable levels. The observed behavior of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, suggests it is unlikely to die out, and the lack of a COVID-19 vaccine that provides long-lasting immunity against infection means it cannot immediately be eradicated; thus, transition to an endemic phase was probable c1f8f94b5a

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
