The CRNA credential was formally established in 1956. Nurses have provided anesthesia care to patients for over 160 years, dating back to the American Civil War (1861–1865).

Allergic reactions to anesthesia Anesthetists are trained to identify Life-threatening hypersensitivity reactions occurring during surgery and anesthesia is around 1 in 10,000 procedures. Severe allergic reactions to anesthetic medications are rare and are usually attributable to factors other than the anesthetic. More recent studies have reported a broader range, that is, 1 in 386 to 1 in 13,000 procedures result in a hypersensitivity reaction. The reported mortality rate from these

reactions ranges between 3-9%.
